- "We plan to travel this weekend to collect mum, DV"; "The wedding will be solemnized on 13th April at St Michaels, DV"; "Bertha Belch, a missionary from Africa, will be speaking tonight at Calvary Methodist, Come hear Bertha Belch all the way from Africa. DV"
- Sorry couldn't resist the last one!

DV - Deo Volente "God willing", has rather fallen out of fashion.

We make our plans - and expect them to occur. We are in control... until we aren't and life spins unexpectedly out of control. A lump appears. The boss calls you in. A loved one is lost. An ordinary day becomes a memorable date.

We don't *DV* anymore – perhaps we should. It serves to remind us of our fragility; that our plans will not necessarily come about.

We would be unwise to live as if life will always be well. We would equally be unwise to live as if nothing ever would be well.

To live DV is to acknowledge life is bigger than I am, and God is bigger than life. To live within the will of God is surely a more certain and accepting place to be, because God's will comes about. And his will is for your wellbeing. "God willing" does not mean God wills the pain and suffering you experience. Life is more complex than that.

It does not mean God wills a particular punishment for you to endure for some sin committed years ago.

These are fatalistic and Karmic views of life. not Christian ones.

God wills wonderful things for each of us. Supreme in his providential care is that we be given the right to become children of God. The right to become is an extraordinary gift, to become more than we are, to become more than we can imagine, to change, to develop, to grow regardless of physical restrictions and circumstances is a wonderful entitlement.

Such is the future laid out for people of Christian faith. Such a future can and will suffer frustrations and deviations from the divine intention. This is a fallen world, but they will ultimately be achieved because DV is our reality.

Hi, my name is Emma, I am from Aston Clinton and volunteer for The Hygiene Bank.

Before I explain my plea, I (on behalf of The Hygiene Bank) thank you sincerely for your continued, kindly donations of hygiene products for those local to us. Your generosity truly overwhelms me every time I am out collecting. So thank you very much indeed.

One location I deliver to is a local Womens' Aid (a non- profit organisation), which cares for women and children who have suffered domestic abuse. These women and children have refuge there and are looked after by a dedicated team of kind-hearted ladies, until they are ready to be rehomed.

On my last delivery I asked the ladies who work there 'Apart from the wonderful donations of hygiene products, is there anything else that you are desperate for?' 'Bed linen' was their immediate response. One of the ladies explained that for the unlimited time that women and children are there, bed linen needs to be replaced on a regular basis. It becomes damaged, soiled and worn. Their request is for bed linen (sheets, pillow cases, pillows etc). 'Anything at all' they said would be extremely useful. I said I would do whatever I could to try and help.

My appeal to you is for fresh, clean bed linen for these women and their children. They have suffered, often for long periods, but now have a secure haven to rest and recover. Perhaps you may have a spare pillow case, or duvet cover, in good condition, but you no longer use it? A basic necessity, which will be gratefully received and very much appreciated.

If you able to contribute any item of single bed linen (in good condition), please contact me and I will be more than happy to collect.

Bucks Council Mental Health

Some of us find it hard to talk about how we're feeling. The pandemic has affected all of us in different ways and, for many, it has been a difficult time.

Mental health issues can affect any of us at any point in our lives. This is why Buckinghamshire Council and our partners in the Suicide Prevention Group and our Champion the Change Hub are promoting good mental health for all.

If you have noticed a relative, friend or colleague isn't their normal self, please just check in with them. Ask if they're really OK and be prepared to #AskTwice if they just say *'Tm fine'*.

If you need to speak to someone, the Bucks 24/7 Mental Health Helpline is a great place to start. Anyone concerned about their mental health or that of a loved one can ring 111 at any time, day or night, to speak to an NHS mental health professional. They are ready to listen and support adults and children who need advice urgently to ensure they get the right help at the right time.

If you have concerns that you or someone you know is about to act on suicidal thoughts call 111 or 999, or go to the nearest Accident and Emergency Department, at Stoke Mandeville Hospital.

Aston Clinton Bowls Club



We're sure everyone was glued to the curling during the Winter Olympics. Curling requires very specialist facilities and you need to be physically capable of delivering your stone and energetic enough to sweep them up the sheet; with so few curling clubs in England, bowls is the next best thing, because there is a club near you!

Judging by the number of likes we are getting on our Facebook page www.facebook. com/Aston-Clinton-Bowls-Club-1587338421538006, there is a lot of interest in the sport.

The club will be holding an Open Afternoon for anyone interested in in a taster session on Monday 2 May-don't worry if you can't make this date, as we will also be offering other sessions as part of the Bowls England's Big Bowls Weekend on Monday 30 May from 2pm. All equipment is provided - all we ask is that you wear flat-soled shoes.

We now have three active club coaches, Ian Watson having qualified to teach beginners at the end of last season. The club is fortunate to have been donated four new sets of coaching bowls, which will help those with smaller or arthritic hands. All are welcome to come along, both families and individuals. If these times are not convenient, we can arrange a session at any time - please contact our secretary *Brian Clark on 01844 351461* or by email brianp.clark29@ gmail.com or drop in while we're playing.

Not only that, but the club has secured a grant from the Queen's Platinum Jubilee Fund to purchase equipment to enable members, both existing and potential, to enjoy our sport for longer. These aids will help less mobile and disabled people to take part. Two of our coaches have undertaken special inclusion training, run by Disability Bowls England, to enable the club to offer bowls to a wider community. We already have ramp access throughout our facilities, a disabled toilet and a green-friendly wheelchair is available.

Bowls is one of the core sports in the Commonwealth Games taking place in July in Birmingham. It has been played at every Games since 1930, with the exception of Kingston in 1966, where no bowls facilities were available. The CWG schedule is fully integrated, with the para-sports taking place at the same time, which again is a first. The venue for the bowls is Victoria Park, Royal Leamington Spa, which is also the location for the National Championships in August/September.

Planning for the 2022 season is complete - fixtures have been confirmed and the club has been chosen to host a number of important matches. These include a Bucks County Ladies game versus Hertfordshire Ladies on 16th May and the Bucks County men v Bedfordshire Men on 28th June. You'd be very welcome to drop in anytime – if you see us on the green as you walk past, why not pop in and watch?

Science & Technology meetings

Science and Technology group meetings are at 10am on the fourth Wednesday of each month. Recent events have included talks on Modern Ear Care and Water Treatments. Visits to the Military Intelligence Museum at RAF Chicksands, Bentley Priory & the Harrow Museum, and the Silverstone Museum of Engineering are planned. Each November the group has a 'Members Participation meeting' with several members giving 10 - 15-minute talks on a relevant topic of their choosing.

Following the successful use of Zoom during the pandemic, some meetings are hybrid with members either attending face to face or logging on electronically. Speakers may also attend in person or give a presentation over Zoom. Further details can be found on the 'Groups' page on the ACu3a website.

Book group 2

A small group of interested u3a members set up a second book group in 2019 and we have met almost every month since. During lockdown our meetings were on Zoom, in 'ordinary' times we meet at a local café. We have read a wide range of fiction and nonfiction books; each member of the group suggests a book for the list, which is usually agreed about six months in advance.



Books we have reviewed include The Salt Path by Raynor Winn, Erebus by Michael Palin, The Unlikely Pilgrimage of Harold Fry by Rachel Joyce, Hamnet by Maggie O'Farrell, and Where the Crawdads Sing by Delia Owens. Following a presentation by a member of the Science and Technology group we decided to read Let It Go by Dame Stephanie Shirley, a book that most of us found fascinating and very inspiring.

Recently we have read The Midnight Library by Matt Haig, an interesting book by an author who writes self-help books such as The Comfort Book and Reasons to Stay Alive.

We have also read A Marriage of Inconvenience: The Persecution of Ruth and Seretse Khama, by Michael Dutfield. This book explores a mixed marriage between the chieftain-in-waiting of the Bamangwato tribe in the British Protectorate of Bechuanaland (modern day Botswana) and a typist from London. Set amid the rise of apartheid in South Africa in the 1950s it provides a detailed and insightful political discourse on the racial tensions and international negotiations underlying the British government's deliberations as to whether they should recognise Seretse Khama as chieftain. The book was made into a film in 2016 called A United Kingdom starring David Oyelowo and Rosamund Pike. It is an interesting read and is the fourth non-fiction book we have tackled.

One of the things we enjoy about the group is that it encourages us to read books outside our usual genre and sometimes outside our comfort zone. It also enables all group members to choose a book they think others will find interesting and possibly challenging. The u3a book groups are necessarily small to ensure everyone has an opportunity to speak on the book in question. A third book group has now been set up to accommodate several members who were interested in joining.

In the office, our clerk has been working on filling the vacant Assistant Clerk position, with final interviews arranged. By the time you read this article, we hope to have our newest member of staff in place.



As the Spring days offer warmer weather and longer days, we appreciate the many bulbs that have been planted in the village and which now give us welcome bursts of colour.

In 2021 we were awarded a grant by Grantscape, from the Gib Lane Solar Fund, towards the extension of the security system/ CCTV which will extend towards the MUGA and skatepark and assist in the prevention of anti-social behaviour and vandalism.

Simply Walk

The group has been going for five years and we have been able to help numerous people who are either recovering from injury or illness, or simply trying to escape the negative effects of a sedentary or solitary lifestyle. Our walks have also provided a forum where many friendships have been made which now extend beyond our weekly activities.

It was therefore extremely heart-warming to learn of the number of members who formed their own walking 'bubbles' during the lockdowns and are now continuing to walk independently, which is really what Simply Walk is all about.

It's also been heartening to see our numbers slowly recover since the last lockdown, back to their pre-covid levels. At our 5th Birthday Party in November we had 31 walkers, old and new, (plus as much cake as we could all eat) and were pleased to welcome-back Fiona Broadbent from Bucks Council, who is the Head of Simply Walk for the County. One sign of getting back to normal has been the recommencement of our monthly 'Progression Walks' which are in addition to our regular weekly 'short' (30-60mins) and 'long' (60-90mins) walks. Progression Walks are primarily provided for anyone who is seriously considering walking with one of the more experienced walking groups such as the Chiltern Society or the Ramblers but are unsure what to expect and/or whether they will be fit enough. It is fundamentally important to us that whatever walk you do, it should be an enjoyable and rewarding experience. So, what we say is: 'if you can successfully complete our three Progression Walks then you know you will be fit enough to take on one of their fivemile walks'... and therefore be able to enjoy the experience, without worrying if you're going to be able to complete it!

Our walks take place every Thursday morning at 10:30 sharp from the car park at Aston Clinton Park (by the new Red Kite Pavilion). Just look for the person in the Hi-Viz jacket. To find details of all Simply Walks available in Bucks and to book a place, please go to our website at buckinghamshire.gov.uk/ simply-walk. However, if you're not an 'internet' person simply turn up on the day a bit earlier and we will try to get you onto a walk that best meets your capabilities. Please come equipped with footwear and clothing suitable for the prevailing weather conditions (and, if you're not sure what that is, we'd be happy to advise you) ... and we'll do the rest.

Following our article in the previous Village Life, here are some more of Margaret Lowe's memories of local life in the early 20th century.

Childhood in the First World War Part 2

Mr Pullen, a young bachelor, owned the Brewery opposite The Bell in Green End Street. He left to join up, leaving his housekeeper, Miss Carter, in charge. She could manage the brewers, but the books were beyond her. My mother, who was a good mathematician, came to the rescue and we were often there while she wrote up the books. When the brewery's off-licence became the Bell Wine Shop, I was reminded of times long ago when shopping there.

Under the Rothschilds, the streets of Aston Clinton were lit with oil lamps. Whilst visiting my great aunt in London, I experienced a Zeppelin raid when we had to have a blackout. The blackout curtains were flimsy in comparison with those used in the Second World War, but we only had oil lamps and candles.

We had an excellent supply of pure water from the Rothschild's Water Works at Dancersend. Electricity, gas and mains drainage only materialised between the wars. Street lighting was not to come until 1949. In the First World War, very few homes had water closets. Earth closets outside the back door were the rule.

The most hated woman in the village was Miss Molique, the daughter of a celebrated German violinist. She was employed by the Rothschilds in a variety of tasks including Further Education. She taught German, Music and Home Economics before they were generally available in country villages. Unwisely, she insisted that children should curtsy to her as they did most willingly to the Rothschilds.



When the First World War was approaching, little girls would hide behind hedges rather than curtsy to her and once the War started it was felt that she was lucky to avoid internment. She was, however, forbidden to leave the village and had to report regularly to the village policeman. I was kept from any contact with her, but once when she passed by on the other side of the road, my mother whispered to me "She's an old German; your Daddy's fighting them!" I was given the same explanation when we encountered a group of German prisoners being marched down Brook Street to work on a farm.

Armistice Day came and we could all hear the hooter from the Rivet Works in Aylesbury proclaiming the great news. I went down to the front gate just as the Rector cycled past on his way to gather the bell ringers together. "The war is over; Mr Lowe will soon be home!" he cried. Three months later my father returned having come across Europe in a cattle truck.

Many children's fathers didn't return and their mothers struggled to bring them up on a pittance. Saddest of all, perhaps was Olive Sheehan (nee Smith) whose Canadian father, returning briefly en route for demobilisation in Canada, said he would send for them as soon as he reached home, kissed them goodbye and was never seen or heard of again.

Almost 1,500 people attended the exhibition which featured 90 different painters, jewellers, potters, and ceramicists displaying almost 750 pieces of art.


In total the charity raised over £16,000 which will be used to support people living with multiple sclerosis.

Village People

This is a series about the people of Aston Clinton, Buckland and Drayton Beauchamp. Some are involved in the daily life of the villages while some, like Mervyn Ramsay, are involved in helping to improve the lives of the disadvantaged.



Q. Over the years you've helped to raise money for the Lord's Taverners. What is the Lord's Taverners and how did you get involved?

A. The Lord's Taverners was founded in 1950 at the Tavern pub at Lord's Cricket Ground. It is the UK's leading youth cricket and disability sports charity. Its mission is to knock down barriers and empower disadvantaged and disabled young people to fulfil their potential and build life skills.

I was introduced to the Lord's Taverners 25 years ago and became a member and volunteer.

For the last five years I have worked for the charity and am primarily responsible for organising and managing our celebrity cricket team along with several fundraising golf days and other charity events. There are currently 900,000 disabled children in the UK and 4.1m living in poverty. The Lord's Taverners creates a range of opportunities for young people with a disability and those from deprived areas to engage in sport and recreational activities in their local communities. These programmes support some of the most marginalised and atrisk young people in the UK.

Q. Have the Covid related restrictions over the past two years affected your fundraising activities?

A. Like many charities Covid has had a major impact on our fundraising but most importantly has had a serious impact on the young people we support who feel isolated at the best of times, never mind during a pandemic. This year is looking very positive with all of our programmes and fundraising activities returning to 'normal'.

Q. During the recent lockdown you were a part of the Aston Clinton Covid Support Group. What did you do?

A. I supported the group by delivering many prescriptions from both Aston Clinton Surgery and Rothschild House Surgery in Tring to residents in the parish.

Q. Are you involved in any other activities or with groups in Aston Clinton?

A. I am proud to be one of the organisers and founders, along with Liz Blake, of Astonbury Music Festival which is again planned for Saturday 13 August – watch out for further information!

Q. When did you move to Aston Clinton?

A. My dad was stationed at RAF Halton and on his untimely passing in 1976 my mum bought a house in Aston Clinton, and I have been in the area ever since.

Q. What are your hobbies, what do you do for fun?

A. Cricket has always been an integral part of my life and after many years of working in IT and Events, my hobby and passion is now my job. Rumour also has it you might find me propping up the bar on occasions at various local watering holes!

Q. What's your favourite music?

A. Genesis

Q. What's your favourite film?

A. Reach for the Sky

Q. What was the first car you owned and what do you drive now?

A. My first car was a 1969 Ford Escort and my current car is a BMW 523 Tourer so I can carry all the kit I need for work.

Q. What changes to village life (good or bad) have you noticed in recent years?

A. With the number of new houses being built in recent years it is disappointing that the services have not been improved accordingly but having lived in the village for so long it is great to see the community spirit that still exists.

Roads

The Parish Council has been reporting the numerous potholes on our roads to the highway authority via Fix My Street. Several were filled within 24 hours of reporting. However, the timescale for repair is generally somewhat longer.

The very poor surface on London Road at Buckland Wharf and on parts of the Lower

Icknield Way have been selected by the Capital team to be resurfaced this year. In the meantime, the highway safety team will inspect this section once a month and will take appropriate action. Currently, the defects are not deep enough to take immediate action.

The overgrown pavements on the Lower Icknield Way and Tring Hill have been reported several times since September, but Buckinghamshire Council has failed to carry out the promised work so far.

Promoting cycling safety

Buckinghamshire Council's road safety initiative, Travel Safe Bucks, is working in partnership with Oxfordshire Fire & Rescue Service to promote their 'Two wheels' campaign – encouraging drivers and cyclists to share the road safely.

With the recent changes to the Highway Code, Travel Safe Bucks wants to promote the rules regarding overtaking cyclists. The changes state that, as a guide, drivers need to leave at least 1.5 metres when overtaking cyclists at speeds of 30mph, and more space than that when overtaking at higher speeds. To remind drivers of this while they're out and about, advertising will be visible on the back of buses around Buckinghamshire and Oxfordshire.

Safe passing isn't the only change to the Highway Code that affects cyclists. There have also been adjustments made to the guidelines around cycling at junctions, cycling at roundabouts and cycling past slow moving or stationary vehicles. These changes have all been made in a bid to keep the most vulnerable road users safe, and it's important that all road users are familiar with them – particularly those who have been driving for some time and may struggle to form new habits.

All drivers should be patient and give priority to cyclists at junctions and roundabouts and follow the new rules on safe passing distances and speeds when overtaking them. Drivers should also be mindful of other vulnerable road users.

Cyclists should follow the updated guidance for road positioning, which includes riding in the centre of the lane on quiet roads, in slower-moving traffic and at the approach to junctions or where roads narrow. Please also wear something bright and make yourself visible and ensure your lights are working and that you are using them.

Better health & wellbeing for all, through nature



With Spring in the air at Lindengate, new life is appearing across our six-acre gardens on a daily basis. Our team, volunteers and programme participants have been busy weeding and planting across the whole site, in preparation for the Summer months.

While Lindengate is perhaps best known for its wellbeing services locally and regionally, our community-fuelled conservation programmes have national reach, supporting the reintroduction of endangered native species into biodiverse landscapes nationwide. In the seven years since opening, the gardens have been nurtured and transformed into what is now a habitat rich biodiverse environment showcasing many of our native species. It is self-sustaining, providing educational opportunities and sufficient stock for us to propagate to the benefit of the wider community. Our team of staff and expert volunteers can offer advice to those looking to rewild their spaces.



Most notable, is that Lindengate is home to the largest clone bank of Black Poplar trees in the UK and is renowned as the leading expert. We were recently honoured by a request from the Greater London Lieutenancy to supply a Black Poplar and attend its ceremonial planting in Regent's Park in honour of the Queen's Platinum Jubilee.

Since opening, we have worked on significant projects with the Butterfly Conservation, Wildlife Trusts and RSPB growing Devils Bit Scabious, the sole food source of the Marsh Fritillary Butterfly, earning us extensive media coverage, but also recognition through our achievement of multiple National and Regional Awards for conservation initiatives.



The Wendover Canal Trust is offering just that. As part of our commitment to local involvement, the Trust is leading a monthly circular guided walk. Wendover Walks will be held on the first Saturday of the month, lasting about 1½ to 2 hours. The first is at 10.30 on 2 April. The walks start and finish at the recently completed Mead Farm Tea Rooms, on the B489 near Wilstone Village.




