Ours is a very small branch of a very large organisation supporting veterans and members of the Armed Forces. Currently, HMS Queen Elizabeth is on a major exercise in the Far East. Over 1000 men and women will be away for over seven months. The RBL will support personnel if they have any difficulties, especially for the families left behind.

Closer to home, in the last 12 months, we have had VE and VJ days when remembrance services were held at the War memorial and £1000 was raised for the RBL.

Due to Covid, branch meetings have not taken place, but we hope to meet again later this year.

It is 100 years since the RBL was founded and to celebrate this, a short commemoration was included in a Sunday morning service, when George presented our banner. Special prayers were said. It was very moving. Also, our branch held a money raising event at the "acar2go" showroom in June. We received many donations towards our main stalls of Raffle, Tombola, and Cakes and £800 was raised. Our thanks to the Rector, Sally, for arranging the presentation in church and to Mark at the "acar2go" showroom for allowing us to use the premises for our centenary event.

Repair Café returns to St Michael's

After a long delay thanks to the Covid pandemic, the Aston Clinton Repair Café returned to St Michael's on 12 June. Pandemics permitting, Repair Café will now be open from 9am to noon on the second Saturday of each month.



On our first day back, we repaired 31 items with a further 11 awaiting parts and raised £328 for the church too. We only had three unrepairable items and by repairing rather than replacing, saved the equivalent CO₂ of flying 2985 miles!

We fixed a variety of items - a vacuum cleaner, a number of lamps, an elephant had his head sewn back on, a teddy had its ear sewn on, trousers were shortened, a sentimental vase was glued back together, a wooden jewellery box lid was fixed, a hair dryer, an iron, a sentimental ivory paper knife was glued back together and a clock got to tick again. Our new jewellery volunteer fixed an earring, a ring and a St Christopher.

One of the reasons the original repair café was set up in Amsterdam was to share skills and for people to learn how to fix things themselves. We had an example of this when a young lady brought in her mum's fairly old sewing machine that wasn't working. Our volunteer diagnosed a part was needed and

looked online, found that part and showed the young lady how to fix it. She was fairly confident she could do it but said if not she would come back to the next café.

If anyone would like to join our friendly group of volunteers, they would be most welcome. Perhaps someone has taken up a new hobby as a result of Covid and would like to share their skills.

Simply Walk-ing Again!

In case you've been wondering whatever happened to Simply Walk, the good news is that it has been able to operate recently under existing HMG Covid guidelines, albeit with restrictions on numbers due to Covid precautions and reduced Leader availability. So, it is still possible for you to join a walk, using the on-line booking system (see below). At present, we are splitting our allocation between two walks: A 'Short walk' and a 'Longer walk'. Note that the slightly longer 'Progression walk' is currently being held in abeyance due to the shortage of walk leaders, some of whom have also been adversely affected by the Covid situation.

To find out when and where the walks are taking place and also to reserve a place on one of them, simply go on-line to buckinghamshire. gov.uk/simply-walk; click on 'how to make a booking' and follow the instructions. Look out for Aston Clinton Weekly Walks (Levels1/2) or Aston Clinton Weekly Walks (Level 3).

However, if you are not an 'on-line' person and would still like to participate, please come down to the park on any Thursday about 15 mins before our official start time (10.30) and talk to one of the leaders in the hi-viz jackets. If there is still a space available on one of our walks they will endeavour to book you onto it but, if not, they will take your details so that you can be booked onto the next available one.

Apart from good footwear and appropriate clothing, please bring with you all your own personal Covid protection and sanitisation equipment, in line with whatever HMG recommendations happen to be in place on the day. In the event of HMG restrictions being lifted as planned, it is hoped that more people will be able to join us and get the benefits of some good post-Covid exercise in our beautiful countryside, throughout the coming summer.

Cricket Club

The first half of the season has been an excellent one for Buckland and Aston Clinton Cricket Club. Following on from last year's shortened campaign it has been a season that is promising much, despite the wetter than usual weather causing a number of cancellations.



Mid-season, the 1st XI is leading Division 3 of the Four Counties Cricket League. Since losing our first match we have been unbeaten, making a great base for a promotion challenge. The batting has been led by Talib Hussein and Safeer Ahmed who are both averaging over 40. Evergreen skipper Mike Parsonage is the leading wicket taker, yet again.

The 2nd XI has suffered more with the weather, having had four games rained off, and sit mid table in Division 5. The batting highlight to date was provided in the first match of the season when Liam Smith's unbeaten 143 and Gary Wiltshire's 75 led to a 201 run opening stand in a nine wicket victory. Captain Casey Dawson is again the top wicket taker, with Kris Greig narrowly behind him.

BACCC has had good success in midweek cricket too, with four wins from the first five games in the new Village T20 league, and the highlight being a double over Tring Park Piranhas. We have also reached the final of the Coronation Cup for the first time in 15 years.

Colts cricket has been revitalised this year, with over 50 youngsters joining us for training and matches. After a low turnout post lockdown in summer 2020 this is easily our highest ever number. For the first time we have had to put some of the younger children on a waiting list and need desperately to recruit more volunteer coaches to be able to satisfy the demand. We have fielded U13 and U15 teams in the Aylesbury & District Midweek League, and have seen some impressive performances. In the U15s we saw a maiden century for Ryan and a first 50 for Jayden in the opening game of the season at Waddesdon. The highlights in the U13s group have been the impressive number of run outs from direct hits in the field, with Tom picking up a hat-trick of those at Bledlow Village, and the powerful hitting (including onto one of the coach's cars) of Rohan, Phil Samuels

Aston Clinton Bowls Club

Bowlers from Aston Clinton Bowls Club have enjoyed a successful start to the season. The men have qualified for the quarter finals of the Bucks Plate, a county-wide competition and the ladies are almost certain to qualify for the Burnham Plate quarter-finals – a competition they reached the final of in 2018. Carol Watson and Cathy Clark have also reached the quarter finals of the ladies' pairs competition, where they will meet the ladies of Stony Stratford.

Our Open Day and the Bowls England Big Bowls Weekend attracted seven new members and all have completed a course of instruction, keeping our registered coaches busy. The Dave Rymer Trophy is named after our former greenkeeper. This year's winner was Clive Latimer, who beat Ian Watson in a keenly fought match.



A game always hotly contested is the annual Villagers versus the Borderers. Those who live in the village play those who live outside its boundary, and for the first time in many years, the Villagers outnumbered the opposition! However, after gentle negotiation, the Borderers were loaned a player and came out the winners. The club was joined for the afternoon by the new Bowls England Clubs and Participation Officer, Alan Lake. The game was followed by tea and cake and the trophy presented to the winning team.

The club is hosting the final rounds of several county competitions, the winners of which will qualify for the National Championships at Leamington at the of August. In September, there are two more county finals on the green and the club's own competition finals will be held on 11th/12th September, so if you are passing, why not come in and watch?

Two days after the finals weekend, the club has the pleasure of hosting the annual Buckinghamshire Men versus the Buckinghamshire Ladies match. Nature reserve gets an 80th birthday present

A wildlife haven spanning the parishes of Aston Clinton, Buckland and Drayton Beauchamp which helped inspire Charles Rothschild to start the UK's nature reserve movement has received a special birthday gift to celebrate its 80th anniversary – a grant of more than £90,000.





The money will be used to further develop Dancersend Reserve which was one of the first nature reserves in the UK. The 211-acre site is where a young Charles Rothschild discovered his love of nature. He went on to help found the conservation society that eventually became The Wildlife Trusts.

Now, the Rothschild Foundation has given the funding to the Berks, Bucks and Oxon Wildlife Trust (BBOWT) to develop the site which was established as a nature reserve in commemoration of Charles Rothschild's achievements 80 years ago.

The donation will provide new equipment, help create a mosaic of new habitats, including a large wildlife pond, and display boards telling the little-known story of Dancersend. BBOWT, which part-owns and manages the reserve, is also planning a series of events to celebrate the anniversary and will work with neighbouring landowners to help protect and enhance the natural environment in the wider area for people to enjoy.

BBOWT CEO Estelle Bailey said

"Dancersend is like the mother of all nature reserves - one of the foundation stones on which The Wildlife Trusts was built. This beautiful place inspired the man who became a pioneer in the UK's nature reserve movement, so it has an important place in history as well as in our hearts."

The Rothschild Foundation commented

" We are proud to continue the work that Charles Rothschild started on the site, which represents a historic turning point in the way that our society interacts with the natural environment. As our entire planet rallies to tackle the problems of global climate change and ecological damage, there has never been a better time to recognise the importance of this modest patch of woods and grassland in the English countryside."

Under BBOWT's care, Dancersend has nearly trebled in size to 211 acres of woodland, chalk grassland and scrub stretching across three parishes - almost all of it open to the public. Nestling in the Chilterns Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty (AONB), the reserve boasts 390 species of flowering plants and ferns, over 800 species of fungi and more than 770 species of butterflies and moths. Mick Jones, volunteer warden at Dancersend said

"As it will be the 80th birthday of the reserve this year I want to publicise Charles Rothschild's story and promote the idea of a memorial to him and the conservation movement he inspired. However, most of the grant will go towards protecting, enhancing and creating habitat for wildlife, especially given the challenges of climate change and increased public use. After a difficult 18 months for our educational and promotional work we are once again able to start offering a series of guided walks and talks to show off Dancersend and other local BBOWT reserves, like Aston Clinton Ragpits."

Work gets underway on lasting tribute to Buckinghamshire's community spirit.



Work has begun on the construction of Nightingale's Rainbow – a new sculptural installation at Stoke Mandeville Hospital in Aylesbury – which will stand to pay tribute to the community spirit and kindness shown across the communities of Buckinghamshire during the pandemic and will be a permanent symbol of hope in the face of adversity.





Village People

Regular readers of Village People will notice that instead of a person who is a part of village life, the focus this time is on someone who we think has an interesting story to tell, local resident and distinguished surgeon Professor Sanu Desai.



Q. What were your early years like?

A. Early years were spent in Mumbai in India. During the 1939-45 war we were evacuated to the country due to the threat of Japanese air attacks. We returned to Mumbai after the war when I finished my schooling and entered Grant Medical College in 1952.

Q. How has you career evolved?

A. After qualifying as a doctor, and to pursue my interest in surgery, I came to England in 1959 for further training. I became a Fellow of the Royal College of Surgeons in 1965. My wife, Nalini, joined me, and we started working in the NHS, first in Bradford then in Leeds, Nottingham and back to Bradford before moving to Birmingham. I started training in plastic surgery in 1962.

We both came to work at Stoke Mandeville Hospital in 1967. The Oxford Regional Plastic Surgery unit is based at Stoke Mandeville. It was founded by Professor Kilner in 1939 whose main interest was

in treatment of children born with cleft lip and palate. While at the unit my interest grew in treatment of cleft children, head and neck cancer, and road accidents involving windscreen injury.

I became Consultant Plastic Surgeon at the unit in 1971 and formulated a plan to operate within 48 hours of birth to repair cleft lip and at four months to repair cleft palate. During my time at the unit we successfully treated 465 new-born babies.

Q. Looking back on your distinguished career, what are you most proud of?

A. Highlights were being elected as President of Plastic Surgery Section of Royal Society of Medicine in 1984 and four years later being awarded the Hunterian Professorship by the Royal College of Surgeons, a unique honour for the original work on operating on new-born babies with cleft lip. But overall, it has to be the successful treatment of so many new-born babies with cleft palate by the time I retired in 1997.

On a personal rather than professional level, following my life-long love of cricket I am proud to have been made a life member of the MCC.

Q. How long have you lived in Drayton Beauchamp?

A. We moved to Drayton Beauchamp in 1975.

Q. What are your hobbies?

A. As a young man I played badminton, cricket, squash and tennis but with age and pressure of work I had to give up. I managed to play golf with a handicap of 9 for few years but no more. My wife and I do like to travel, especially cruising, and have

visited many countries around the world since retiring.

Q. What was the first car you owned and what do you drive now?

A. My first car was red frogeyed Austin Healey Sprite bought in 1960. I liked fast cars and always wanted a Bentley and a Porsche. My Bentley T2 is now a classic car but sadly I had to sell the Porsche 911 Turbo I owned for 32 years as I couldn't get in or out of it anymore! I now mainly drive a Mitsubishi Outlander Plug-in Hybrid.

Q. What changes to village life (good or bad) have you noticed in recent years?

A. Drayton Beauchamp is generally very quiet and peaceful but increased traffic now causes some problems. This pandemic has changed the way we live, the way we work, the way we travel and the way we look after others. The village remains a friendly, supportive community especially during this period.

Still not mowing...

As last year, we have avoided mowing our front lawn. Plantlife wanted the first Every Flower Counts' to be done in late May, and after the bizarre Spring weather our tally was disappointing, although our nectar score for pollinators was higher than both the previous year and the national average. We were asked to count again for a week in July, and we did, but I rather suspect as far as orchids are concerned, they were probably past their peak.



On the morning of 22nd June we counted 45 bee orchids, five pyramidal orchids, three twayblades and one common spotted orchid, amongst a sea of swaying dog daisies and grass. I have lived here over 40 years and the occasional bee orchid has always popped up when we were a bit tardy with the mowing, but never in numbers like this.

The odd thing is that nothing appears on the back lawn. We have tried letting that grow, and all we get is long grass. We can only assume that when the bungalows were built in the 1960s, the front lawn was old pasture land with all the precious chalk flora dormant for all those years. The builders presumably imported some soil for the back from somewhere less interesting elsewhere.

We count ourselves very lucky and look forward to new things popping up in future years. *Alison Beck*

Strawberry Ice-Cream with Raspberry Sauce

Our recipe this time is provided by our crossword compiler, Helen Lonsdale.



Ingredients:

1 ½ lbs (675g) strawberries3oz (75g) castor sugar½ pint (300ml) double cream

Method:

- 1. Put hulled strawberries and sugar in food processor and reduce to a puree.
- 2. Push through a fine food mill to catch the pips.
- Whip cream till thick but not solid and fold into puree. Pour into a shallow tin or metal ice-tray and freeze.
- 4. Take out after 45 minutes and put in a food processor (or beat by hand).
- Return to freezer with lid. Remove from freezer 1 hour before using.

As with many country churches, St Mary's has long had insufficient income for its upkeep.

Much urgent external and internal work is needed - without it, the future of this very attractive, historic church and its surroundings are threatened and the result could be closure.
