We were delighted to hear that local resident Luther Blissett has been awarded an OBE in the Queen's Jubilee honours list for his charity work.



70 trees for 70 years

Earlier this year Buckinghamshire Council asked residents and visitors to nominate their favourite tree or woodland to celebrate the natural beauty of the county, and to support the themes of the Platinum Jubilee and the Queen's Green Canopy project.

The project encourages the planting of trees to create a legacy in honour of The Queen's leadership of the nation, which will benefit future generations.

Among those chosen in the final 70 was this excellent picture taken in Aston Clinton Park by local resident, Eliza Alqassar, who said

"I nominated the group of three huge Wellingtonia trees because they hold historic value as they were planted in the 19th century as part of the designed landscape of Green Park/Aston Clinton Park for the Rothschild family. They really stand out in the landscape for being unusual, ornamental and are a real eyecatcher in an otherwise flat parkland.

I love these trees because they are tall (like me!) and because when the first lockdown ended and we were finally able to meet friends outside again I had a picnic underneath them with good friends – a special moment.

They provide shelter in the rain and shade in the summer and are a perfect place to sit and reflect while on my many dog walks around the park."

The 70 Trees for 70 Years will now be compiled into a photobook which will be available across the county's libraries later in the year.

Buckinghamshire Council has been supporting The Queen's Green Canopy and gifted new trees to 236 schools, care homes and nurseries in the county.

More than 1,380 trees have so far been planted in Buckinghamshire and logged on the Queen's Green Canopy map, plus the council's new woodland at Billet Field with over 3,000 new trees which will be added to the map this autumn.

As well as inviting the planting of new trees, The Queen's Green Canopy will dedicate a network of 70 Ancient Woodlands across the United Kingdom and identify 70 Ancient Trees to celebrate Her Majesty's 70 years of service.

Cricket club

The first half of the 2022 season has been action packed, with lots of highlights so far and plenty to play for in the second half.

The senior 1st XI has made a positive return to Division 2 of the Four Counties Cricket League, with five wins, three defeats and a rain cancellation leaving us third in a tight table at the halfway stage. The highlight so far has undoubtedly been setting the club record highest league score (373 for 7) and recording the largest victory margin (350 runs) away to New City. Shah Bukhari is the top run scorer so far and Adnan Zaib the leading wicket taker.

The 2nd team has struggled a bit more, with poor availability the main cause. This is reflected in them sitting 8th out of 10 in Division 5. Neil Roberts has scored the most runs (despite playing less than half the games) and captain Casey Dawson has taken the most wickets. The bright spot has really been the emergence of some of our younger players who are moving up from the colts into open age cricket. The 2nd XI also provided the bulk of the players for our successful tour of Sussex, with the highlight being Evan Wakelam's amazing turnaround in fortunes - with a first ball duck in game 1, being run out without facing a ball in game 2, but then an unbeaten maiden century in the final game.

The senior midweek side has won their opening five Village T20 group games with Neil Roberts hitting fifties in all four matches he has played in. We have a couple more to play before a quarter-final awaits and a return to the finals day.

It has been a busy couple of months for the Junior section too. We are welcoming more children than ever to our practice sessions after the recruitment of a large number of volunteers to help make this possible. There have been frequent matches for the Under 11s and Under

15s in the midweek league. There have been real signs of progression and, as always, a really good team spirit on the field. The Under 17s only really get going in July after exams are over, but several of this group are already regularly playing 2nd XI matches, anyway.

Adventurous weekend

In late May this year Aston Clinton Scouts turned out in impressive numbers for a weekend of outdoor adventure at the PACCAR Scout Camp, Chalfont St. Peter.

Twenty-three ambitious Scouts, plus superb Young Leaders Jay and Sophie, skilfully setup their tented encampment on the Friday evening. Along with them were two special guests - two adventurous young Ukrainians, Serafym and Anastasiia - looking forward to sharing three days of outdoor activities and sleeping in tents deep within the secluded woodland setting of PACCAR.

The industrious scouts displayed admirable team work in their designated patrols as they lit then used altar fires to cook their own meals using wood fuel that they collected from the forest floor.

During the weekend each patrol made valiant efforts on the daunting challenges they faced, be it high-roping up in the tree canopy, abseiling vertically down a 20ft wall, or learning how to accurately fire a long bow. A very well fuelled campfire (thanks to Manny!) created a warm, flame-lit setting for the traditional Saturday night campfire songs, enthusiastically led by Assistant Scout Leader, David Ball, who had also spent considerable amounts of his personal time planning and facilitating the whole weekend. Sincere thanks should also be given to Mr and Mrs Winfield for the extra help, so tirelessly given, to 'dismantle' the camp and return the equipment to Aston Clinton. 1st Aston Clinton Scout Leaders

2020 saw the plans to celebrate the 200th anniversary put to one side because of Covid. Now in 2022, we are going ahead to hold the celebration on Saturday 1st and Sunday 2nd October.

On the Saturday at 2pm there will be a brief thanksgiving service (1/2 hr. max). There will then be a village scarecrow competition and a display of pictures showing life in the village and in the church. We have also put together a booklet which covers our 200 plus years of history which will be on sale, with all proceeds going to the church funds. Refreshments will be available. 

Q. How long have you been involved with Village Life?

A. I took on the role of Advertising Manager 10 years ago and retired in April.

Q. Does your wife, Helen, also contribute to Village Life?

A. Helen compiled her first crossword for the magazine in Oct/Nov 2013 and her 50th. due in Oct/Nov will be her last. She has also provided several recipes.

Q. How has the publication changed over the years?

A. The former Parish Magazine ceased publication in Dec 2010. Fortunately, Alec Just and his wife Jenny moved to Aston Clinton, and he took up the challenge as editor and

the first edition of Village Life was published in April/ May 2011. The new version consisted of a 4-page colour cover and 32 pages black and white text with a circulation of 1800. Alec retired in 2018. We greatly appreciated his immense contribution in its transformation. Richard Vincent offered his services to assist Alec with editorial and we were delighted he took over the full editorial role in April 2018.

With the support of our wide range of contributors, advertisers and our 40+ tireless distributors, our magazine has gone from strength to strength with 64 pages in full colour and over 2700 copies circulated locally.

Q. There are several publications that claim to be local, how is Village Life different?

A. The majority of freebie magazines crammed through our letterboxes are run commercially with very few items of local interest. We like to feel ours is packed with useful information, local editorials, events, community news, puzzles and more. It's a fantastic way to communicate with local people and support local businesses.

Q. How long have you lived in Drayton Beauchamp?

A. We moved to Drayton Beauchamp from Barnet 31 years ago and enjoy the peace and tranquillity while still in easy reach of all the local facilities and road networks.

Q. What's your background?

A. My family, including three sisters, started life in Clapham. I was the last to marry in 1969. I spent my first 10 working years as a print buyer in London's top advertising agencies before taking sales positions with several printing companies for 34 years. My last 14 years were spent as a director of Maund & Irvine in Tring, before retiring aged 61.

Q. Are you involved in any activities or groups in Drayton Beauchamp and/or Aston Clinton?

A. Helen and I joined the AC u3a 15 years ago and have enjoyed our involvement with the Digital Photography, Art and Science & Technology groups. We have been members of the ACB& DB Horticultural Society for many years. I have organised four Fiddle Concerts for charity, Drayton Beauchamp walks including lunch, Lark Rise tours and Theatre in the Village shows.

I served on the Rights of Way committee for Drayton Beauchamp and in 2011, Margaret Ross and I took up the challenge from the Bucks County Council to celebrate the millennium and chose to produce 'The Village That Time Passed By' book. The occupants of 46 properties in the parish were interviewed and photographed and their properties were researched to provide a history of each dwelling. I asked for old photos for added interest, which I managed to enhance. 300 copies were sold and 100 reprinted with the project breaking even.

Q. What are your hobbies, what do you do for fun?

A. In my younger days, I enjoyed football, squash and cycling. Two or three times a week, for over 20 years, I have played at Halton Tennis Club and being a South Londoner, have supported Crystal Palace FC for 61 years, only missing the odd game each season. My son Edward and grandson James join me and enjoy the day out, meeting up with old friends.

I also enjoy poring over OS Maps to find new walks and planning itineraries for holidays away, with my camera always at the ready.



I have visited 44 countries (not cruising) and travelled extensively throughout the UK.

Horticultural Society

I am starting this article on the hottest day of the year so far. (we always open with the weather!). Consequently, no gardening has been done since early morning. and then it was only watering. Despite watering the greenhouse, the leaves of the tomatoes and cucumber still wilt, the heat is that intense. Watering is a "do" but don't cut your lawn; it will only turn brown and don't water lawns, that only wastes water, a precious commodity. New growth will appear with cooler weather and rain.

Tips for watering in a heatwave -

The best times to water your garden is early in the morning, or once the sun has gone down in the evening.

Water the soil not the plant. It is better to give your plants a big soak twice a week than little amounts every day. Water deeply not just the surface - say 20 seconds per plant.

Adding a layer of bark or other mulch to your border helps retain moisture. Pots can be top dressed with bark or pebbles/gravel.

Containers are particularly vulnerable to drying out so water more frequently, probably daily. Also, if possible, move them temporarily to a shadier spot.

Ukrainian potato pancakes

Recipe written by Anna, a refugee from Kyiv, Ukraine. Anna and her children are currently staying with a host family in Aston Clinton.



Ingredients:

- 5 potatoes
- 1 egg
- 1 onion
- 1 ½ tablespoons of Plain flour
- 2 cloves of garlic
- 1 teaspoon of salt Pepper to taste

Method:

- Finely grate the onions, then finely grate the potatoes and immediately combine. (This will stop the potatoes from turning brown.)
- Add the beaten egg, sift the flour, add the garlic, salt and pepper.
- 3. Stir until smooth
- Pour vegetable oil into a heated frying pan, put a tablespoon of mixture into the pan and spread out.
- Fry until golden brown on both sides, they will cook very quickly.
