`For unto us a child is born...'



Someone once reflected that 'There's so much news of so much trouble available in so many ways that my mind is filled with pictures and headlines that bombard me from morning to evening and don't let me rest. But then I pause for a moment and begin to reflect: What was news like for people in Jesus's day? What were they thinking about on the day Jesus was born? Was it any different at all?'

I don't think so ...

Two thousand years ago, the 'headlines' in Israel were likely the same as ours today. They probably read something like: King Herod the Great jealously executed his third son in only three years. Roman soldiers strike down hundreds of Jewish protesters in the streets of Jerusalem. Tax collectors again increase gate tax by two denarii per family.

Different names, different rulers, different contexts – but essentially the same kind of news. And this must have been in people's minds during this very same season just as today's news is in ours.

Just imagine: The night Jesus was born, the people in Israel were concerned about the government, economy, taxes and some even about what King Herod's fourth wife was wearing. But no one cared about the birth of a little baby boy in Bethlehem, a small town of some 500 people.

No one heard about it, no one read about it, no one talked about it. It wasn't in the news.

While everyone was thinking about what was going on in the world of their day, they failed to see the greatest news of all in history. It slipped in under the radar.

So right now, as you read this, I encourage you to stop and think about the 2,000-year-old story that is still more important than anything you've read or will read in the news today.

Pause for a moment and ask yourself: How has Christ's coming – born in a small town in Israel, unreported at the time, but celebrated again by us this coming year as God's greatest intervention in history – touched and changed your life?

If you find that it hasn't, ask yourself why. However you answer, may the peace of the Christ child be known by you and yours this Christmas.

Christmas gift appeal to help Bucks children



The annual Buckinghamshire Christmas gift appeal is being led by new local charity Inspire Bucks.

Now in its seventh year, the appeal is a big drive to give Christmas presents to vulnerable children in Buckinghamshire who otherwise might not receive much – or anything – at Christmas.

Last Christmas almost 1,200 Christmas gifts were presented to children, young people and families with disadvantaged backgrounds. And funds also allowed birthday presents to be given throughout the year.

Inspire Bucks chairman Paul Irwin says that the disruptive effects of the coronavirus pandemic make it all the more important to ensure children in crisis or need have a happy Christmas.

"These Christmas gifts go directly to very vulnerable children here in our county, and I've seen the wonderful difference this makes to their families. Thanks to the fantastic generosity last year, Christmas was a time of cheer for these families. This year I'm asking the people of Buckinghamshire to pull out the stops again!"

In the interests of safety, he says, the appeal is inviting donations of money online. Gifts of money would ensure suitable presents could be bought for all ages, including children with additional needs and disabilities, older children and young people leaving the Council's care.

COVID-19 and flu vaccines in pregnancy

Covid-19 vaccines are recommended in pregnancy. The vaccine is safe and effective at any stage of pregnancy.

Vaccination is the best way to protect against the known risks of Covid-19 in pregnancy for both women and babies, including admission of the woman to intensive care and premature birth of the baby.

Pregnant women may wish to discuss the benefits and risks of having the vaccine with their healthcare professional and reach a joint decision based on individual circumstances. However, as for the non-pregnant population, pregnant women can receive a Covid-19 vaccine even if they have not had a discussion with a healthcare professional.

In addition, influenza (flu) can be a serious disease in pregnant women. To protect women and their babies the flu vaccination is recommended.

One Kind Word

At Aston Clinton School we take part in the national Anti-Bullying Week each November. This year's theme was 'One Kind Word'.

It was a child in Year 6 who inspired this article. His kind words and mature attitude have a changed another child's feelings of despair and struggle to ones of hope and happiness. In his words:

'when you're kind to others it makes you feel better, it makes you feel like you've achieved something and it helps them feel better about the day. You can show you're being kind by smiling at them, giving them a high five, telling a joke and just making them laugh."

Kindness and care is more important today than it has ever been. The isolation of the last eighteen months has underlined how little acts of consideration can break down barriers and brighten the lives of the people around us.

Kindness is taught in every religious faith. Be it Hinduism, Sikhism, Christianity, Judaism, Islam or any other religion, they all instruct us to show compassion towards others. This requirement is not limited to human application. Cruelty to all living creatures is a sin in many religious scriptures. Even nature has its way of communicating appreciation and compassion.

Trees grow large and produce fruit in response to the kind behaviour of their caregivers.

At Aston Clinton School we consider that kindness should be seen as a basic value, which is inherent in us all. It can be shown in small ways such as being courteous or giving a little bit of food to the stray dog who comes near the house every day, or in more significant ways like providing someone with care and encouragement. These gestures of kindness don't always take a lot of time, but they go a long way to creating a spirit of goodwill. Being compassionate to your parents, friends and neighbours helps create a sense of belonging, a sense of calm and a sense of well-being.

An individual with a generous temperament who shows respect towards everyone is considered to be kind. These individuals are compassionate to others and, if there is a need, support those around them and never fail to go out of their way to put joy on the faces of others. Although kindness has an undertone of innocence and vulnerability, that's not the case. Being compassionate also calls for bravery and determination.

So, thank you, Louis Price for giving me the inspiration to write this. You have not only supported another child with your kindness, you have shown us all how to 'care'.

Chip Shop Chips & Air Ambulance...



Not two phrases that are often seen together! However, on 6 October at 6pm 1st Aston Clinton Cubs walked nearly 4 miles through Wendover woods on a sponsored Chip Shop walk to raise money for Thames Valley Air Ambulance.

They followed a route that they had planned a couple of weeks previously by using printed maps and string to work out the mileage. They left that evening meeting armed with sponsorship forms and a mission to raise at least £2.50 each.

27 Cubs, five Leaders, one Young Leader, five Parent Helpers, four siblings and Nala the dog set off at dusk and ascended from the bottom of Manson Hill to the car park at the top. The obligatory visit to the Gruffalo and quickly on down the Firecrest trail and then up the other side of the woods. It was now completely dark and head torches were on. We then looped round the lower path of the woods to emerge at the top of Beechwood Lane... We could smell the chips!

The first group arrived at Wendover Plaice Fish & Chips at 7.35pm and the rest of the groups quickly followed. The reward for a nearly four-mile walk.... a tray of hot chips and a big squirt of ketchup.

Buckinghamshire Scouting district had teamed up with Thames Valley Air Ambulance to produce a badge to provide different challenges for Beavers & Cubs. Fund raising for the Air Ambulance was an option towards earning this badge.

1st Aston Clinton Cubs rose to the challenge and we proudly raised £1005! *Clare Simmonds*

Still Simply Walk(ing):

Although the weather this summer wasn't exactly the ideal 'bucket & spade' type, it has been very good for walking, as it's not been too hot and has remained relatively dry. This has meant all our walking routes have remained open for us to enjoy. Following the lifting of covid restrictions, we are currently providing a basic 'short' walk of 30-60 mins for beginners and those with limited mobility, plus a 'longer' walk of 60-90 mins for those who feel more able.

As covid restrictions have been relaxed, and more people have been getting out and about, it's been really good to meet up again with an increasing number of 'old friends' from our villages and beyond. Apart from Aston Clinton there are now over 50 similar walks operating throughout Buckinghamshire, with more re-starting every week. Aston Clinton Parish Council



The Parish Council has been active on many fronts in the last few months. We recently welcomed four new members to the council to restore us to the full complement of eleven. They are Ashley Judge and Alun Goode, plus Patricia Birchley and Mike Collins who are also Buckinghamshire councillors. Our thanks go to outgoing councillors Liz Tubb, Sam Howard, Aafke Watton, and Andrew Duffield, for their service to the council and the village over a number of years, particularly former chairman, Liz, for her work on several projects, not least the new community centre.

We also welcome our very experienced new clerk, Samantha Payne, and we all look forward to moving the council forward under her guidance. More about your parish councillors and our exciting projects for 2022 in the next issue!

With the recent accidents in the village the speeding problem is at the forefront again. This has been a long-standing issue and with increased traffic nearby it has intensified. In 2016, when the Neighbourhood Plan was being formulated, an independent traffic survey was commissioned. This identified the high levels of traffic that new developments

were going to generate through the village. Consequently, a creative traffic mitigation design was produced. It can be viewed on our website, and within the AC Neighbourhood Plan. The scheme was then adopted by Transport for Bucks (TFB) to be initiated when funding was available. The sections from The Bell to Wenwell Close have been discussed and were to go to public consultation in November but this has been delayed by Bucks Council. However, if the consultation is positive it should be implemented next year. There are two further schemes being implemented in association with the Community Board; one is a proposed 20 mph zone covering Green End St, Brook St. and Twitchell Lane, and the other is for parking restrictions around the roundabout by the petrol station which will improve sightlines. Both will be put out for consultation soon.

The Red Kite Pavilion is fully operational, and welcomes many people to the café as well as offering local groups both the main hall and upstairs meeting rooms for a variety of uses and functions. The village can be very proud of its new community facility in the park.

Aston Clinton u3a

The Aston Clinton u3a is an activity and learning based organisation aimed at retired people from all walks of life. We have over 250 members and 30+ activity groups including book groups, walking groups, history, movie making and science and technology groups. In addition, we organise outings, theatre trips and holidays, although these have obviously been considerably curtailed due to Covid.

There is no age requirement for joining, simply an interest in meeting with like-minded people and joining in one or more of the varied groups and activities offered. We are always

looking for new members interested in starting up new groups and are currently considering a new 'cook and eat' group and starting up a third book group. *Membership is just £15 per year*.

A few years ago, market research firm GfK NOP called to ask a load of questions. There wasn't a question about faith, or inclination, or if I was looking forward to the festivities - so this simply confirmed my long-held belief that Christmas has become nothing more than the official measure of the nation's propensity to spend.

Imagine the shock and horror in homes up and down the country as children hear that Christmas is curtailed. Not to mention the upset at No 11 Downing Street.

me that people would think I was dead. But she was happy to be omitted from my list, and I was removed from hers. The list still seems to grow, though it proved useful so we knew who to notify when we moved.

As for the feast, there is only so much each of us can eat, and yet the trolley loads wheeled out of supermarkets are excessive. A good, preferably local, bird with all the trimmings, washed down with a decent wine does appeal, though.

The decoration box will still come down from the attic, and holly, ivy and mistletoe will be gathered. The few cards we will no doubt receive will still feature on the mantelpiece. There will be extra telephone/video calls and some emails and/or letters to write, a family dinner, carol services and a party or two. This avoids a stressful Advent and unnecessary headache without spoiling the planet.

Did I carry out my threat? Indeed, I did, encouraged by an acquaintance who told me it's all a lot of nonsense. She hadn't done Christmas for years, and no one thinks any worse of her.




So, a short, green, lean, happy Christmas to everyone.

Vegan Wellington

We always like to introduce a seasonal recipe in Village Life and last time we asked if anyone had any ideas for a vegan dish for Christmas. We are delighted to say that Maria Harty has stepped up to the plate with this recipe she originally found on the BBC.

A mushroom, sweet potato and cranberry dish which can be frozen and is free of dairy and egg products.



Serves 6. Prep: 45 minutes. Cook: 1 hr and 15 mins plus cooling and chilling

Ingredients:

90g dried porcini mushrooms

2 tbsp olive oil

1 large onion, finely chopped

250g chestnut mushrooms, finely chopped

2 garlic cloves, crushed

500g sweet potatoes, peeled, cut into 2cm chunks

1 tbsp finely chopped rosemary

1 tbsp finely chopped sage, plus 4 whole leaves

100g soft white breadcrumbs

2 tbsp pomegranate molasses

40g chopped walnuts or pecans

40g dried cranberries

grating of nutmeg

2 x 320g sheets dairy-free puff pastry

plain flour, to dust

3 tbsp plant-based milk

1 tbsp English mustard or Dijon mustard with a pinch of turmeric

Method

- 1. Put the dried mushrooms in a heatproof bowl and pour over 500ml boiling water. Stir and press them down so they are well covered, then leave to soak.
- 2. Heat the olive oil in a wide frying pan over a medium heat and fry the onion and chestnut mushrooms for about 20 mins, until the veg is very soft and the mushrooms look wilted and reduced.
- 3. Stir in the garlic and sweet potatoes, then the rehydrated mushrooms and their soaking liquid, leaving the last dregs of the liquid in the bowl (this may contain grit from the mushrooms). Cover and cook for 15 mins until the sweet potatoes are just softened, and most of the liquid has evaporated. Add a splash more water halfway through if the liquid evaporates too quickly.
- 4. Remove the lid and stir in the chopped herbs, breadcrumbs, molasses, nuts and cranberries. Season well and sprinkle in the nutmeg. The mixture should be stiff enough to resemble stuffing, but not dry all the breadcrumbs should be coated and have absorbed some of the liquid.Remove from the heat and leave to cool in the pan.
- 5. Once cool, unroll one of the puff pastry sheets onto a lightly floured non-stick baking sheet or baking tray lined with baking parchment. Whisk the milk and mustard together with a pinch of salt and set aside.
- 6. Spoon the cooled filling down the middle of the pastry sheet in a neat line, leaving a 5cm border around the edges. Use the mustard-milk mix to brush the borders, then top with the second pastry sheet. Press the pastry around the filling to remove any air pockets, then crimp to seal the sides. Trim off any excess pastry with a sharp knife and use a fork or your fingers to make a pattern around the edge of the wellington.
- 7. Cut a small steam hole in the top of the middle, then brush the top with the mustard-milk mix. Chill on the sheet or tray for 30 mins. (It will keep in the fridge for up to two days).
- 8. Heat oven to 200C/180C fan/gas 6. Remove the wellington from the fridge and brush with more of the mustard-milk mix. Bake for 35-40 mins until golden, puffed up and crisp cover with foil if it's browning too quickly. Arrange the whole sage leaves on top of the wellington and stick them down with the mustard-milk mix. then return to the oven for 10 mins
- 9. Leave to rest on a board or platter for 10 mins before cutting into chunky slices to serve.

Horticultural Society

Another year has almost passed and despite the lockdown our society has had a very successful year. 2022 is the Queen's Platinum Jubilee and the Society plans, with the parish council's permission, to celebrate the occasion by planting an oak tree in the park, similar in size to the elm trees we planted last year. There is a nationwide project, "The Queen's Green Canopy", a unique tree planting initiative created to mark Her Majesty's Platinum Jubilee which invites people from across the UK to "Plant a Tree for the Jubilee". As part of the project the Woodland Trust is providing hundreds of thousands of trees to schools and community groups as part of the project. Further information can be found on woodlandtrust.org.uk.



We also hope that individuals and families will join in and plant a tree for the Jubilee.

The last Society event of 2021 is a social evening in the Anthony Hall, on Wednesday 8 December, starting at 8pm. The officers and committee wish members and non-members a very Happy Christmas and a prosperous growing New Year. The cost of joining us is a modest £5 per annum. Membership runs from January to December and we have an exciting programme to look forward to.

We start the new year on Wednesday 12 January, 8pm, with our AGM. Though this is formal, we plan to follow it with a glass of wine and general chat so that new members can get to know the committee and other members. We can talk informally about our shows and plant sales. All our talks are held in the Anthony Hall and start at 8pm.

Our February talk could be the most important of the year. Geraint Richards is head Forester for the Duchy of Cornwall, where he has worked for many years. We have been trying to get Geraint to talk to us for ages. It is with the advent of Zoom that he is able to give a talk to us in the Anthony Hall. His talk on Wednesday 9 February, 8pm, is called, "The Duchy of Cornwall, its trees, woodlands and forests". If you are interested and not a member please come on the night and pay £2 visitor fee or better still, join the Society!

As the colder, darker weather continues, it is tempting to stay in the warm rather than exercise. However, it is important for us all to maintain our physical and mental wellbeing.


There are many benefits to spending just a few minutes a day outdoors. Here are a few of them:
