Calibre Audio

National charity Calibre Audio is encouraging eligible local people to join its free audiobook service and offering the additional opportunity to take part in book groups being set up specifically for its members in Bucks.



Based in Aylesbury, Calibre Audio supports adults and children across the UK with a wide range of different print disabilities. These include blindness and visual impairment, learning difficulties such as dyslexia and ADHD, neurological conditions, physical disability that prevents holding a book and even long COVID.

Emma Scott, Director of Commissioning and Editorial explains:

"By offering free audiobooks to those who struggle to read print we can support learning and open up new interests and possibilities for them. Whether it's help to understand and follow an educational text, broadening their knowledge on specific subjects of interest or the ability to immerse themselves in a great story to help with relaxation, having free access to audiobooks can be transformative."

"We're now delighted to be able to take this one step further for our adult members in Bucks by offering regular book groups giving them a chance to meet other like-minded local people and get involved in lively discussions about the group's chosen books."

"We're keen to encourage anyone in Bucks who is eligible but not yet a Calibre member to join the service and register their interest in our book groups."

Calibre Audio has a collection of more than 14,000 audiobooks ranging from the classics and the latest bestsellers to non-fiction and poetry.

There is also an extensive collection for children, including many GCSE and A level set texts. Audiobooks can be downloaded to or streamed on any device or listened to via USB memory stick.

LitterLotto Local

Buckinghamshire Council has worked with LitterLotto to launch an extra monthly prize for residents who do the right thing and bin their waste. By working closely with LitterLotto to create a geofence around Buckinghamshire, the council can now reward local people who bin their rubbish and help keep litter off the streets and out of our beautiful countryside.

LitterLotto is a free to enter prize draw with regular spot prizes and huge jackpots. To enter, residents simply use the app to take a picture of litter as they place it in a bin. Each time they submit a new piece of litter it's another chance to win. 85% of litter binned via the app is 'fugitive' rubbish that was on the floor or out in the environment. The more local users the app has, the more litter will end up in the right place - the bin.

The new initiative sees an extra monthly prize draw of £250 just for binning litter in Buckinghamshire. By introducing an extra prize draw the council hopes to reward people who bin their litter and hopefully encourage more people to bin it to win it.

Gareth Williams, Buckinghamshire Council's Cabinet Member for Environment and Climate Change, said:

"We spend £2.5million cleaning the streets of Buckinghamshire and unfortunately, much of the tidying up is picking up litter, despite having over 4,000 bins emptied regularly across the county. With the new LitterLotto Local initiative, we want to encourage people to protect their surroundings and reward the right behaviour. If we can get more litter in bins, we can save some money that we are currently spending litter picking and divert it to other projects or services."

The initiative with LitterLotto launched in November and will run for 12 months. 
Francis John (Frank) Smith and the Ernest Townsend painting

Many of you will remember the book 'Drayton Beauchamp: The Village that Time Passed By' which was published in 2011 after four years of hard work by David Lonsdale (photographer) and myself (author).

One of the former villagers who provided valuable information for the book was Peter Smith, whose ancestors had for many years lived at the 'top end' of the parish – at Terriers End and Hang Hill Cottages. Peter worked at Painesend and Dancersend Farms for 50 years and in 1966 in a definite departure from his usual work he appeared as an extra in the black and white comedy film 'The Specialist'. This film starred Bernard Miles as a country carpenter who specialises in the construction of 'superior privies' and was filmed locally. Peter and his wife Sylvia moved to Weston Turville in 2001 but Peter retained an encyclopaedic knowledge of the history, topography and residents of this special corner of Buckinghamshire.

Peter was very proud of his father Frank, a gunner with the Royal Artillery in World War II. Frank left home to serve abroad in 1939 when Peter was only three. He did not return at the end of the war, dying in a military hospital on the south coast on 28th March 1945. He is commemorated on the Tring War Memorial, although sadly not in Drayton Beauchamp.

Peter prized a photograph of his father taken when the troops were returning from the Dunkirk Retreat in May 1940. This photo is reproduced in the village book and below. Imagine my astonishment when, on opening The Times on 23rd May of this year I came face to face with the same photograph, but now in the form of a painting by Ernest Townsend.



who is reported to have been delighted to accept it. It was discovered in Churchill's studio when he died in 1965. Now painstakingly restored, it has recently been returned to Chartwell and is once again proudly on display there. I am grateful to the National Trust for allowing me to reproduce a digital image of this painting here (Ref. CMS_1102534_3).

Although the artist has made changes to the background and to some of the figures in the photograph, Frank Smith is instantly recognisable as the young man in the centre of both images, supporting a wounded comrade who is walking with the aid of a stick.

Sadly, Peter Smith died four years ago so he never knew of his father's posthumous fame or of the fact that his image is now prominently displayed in such a famous setting. I believe it is fitting that we should pay tribute to this very local hero – shown in both photograph and painting as a kind, compassionate young man – who gave his health and ultimately his life for his country. *Margaret Ross*

Aston Clinton School



Aston Arrows

We are Aston Arrows, a small racing team made up of a group of year 6 children working at Aston Clinton School in an after-school club.

We are building a battery-powered (ecofriendly) race car to compete with other schools around the country. The project is run by a charity called GreenPower, who aim to provide an understanding of STEM (science, technology, engineering, maths) in schools, in order to encourage more children into STEM-based employment.

The project started just before the summer holidays when we chose which area we wanted to work in:

- body work team (designing and building the bodywork of the car)
- framework team (build the structure of car)
- · media team (promoting the project to wider community and keeping a log of our activity)
- fundraising team (writing to local companies and organising fundraising events)
- · financing team (keeping track of our accounts).

Each week, we either work on jobs for our chosen areas, sharing our progress regularly with the whole group, or we engage with a fun STEM activity to get us thinking about an aspect of the car design and engineering. Everyone in Aston Arrows has already learnt how to use tools, both manual and power, has designed potential environmentally friendly



bodyworks for the car and has investigated how we might make the car go faster on race days using the laws of physics.

Once we have built the car, we will learn to drive it and enter race days set up by GreenPower. We will be competing with other children from around the country. At race days, we will all need to take on different roles, from drivers to logistics team, pit-stop team and technical team.

At the end of the school year, we will dismantle the car and get the framework ready for the next year's year 6 children to start the same journey with their own design of Goblin car.

None of this could have been possible without support from local people and STEM ambassadors living in the village, as well as Jaguar Landrover, who have sponsored us. Obviously, this type of experience is invaluable for the children in terms of business skills and STEM enrichment. The whole venture will need to be supported by donations and

Hot on the heels of another successful village litter-pick and tidy-up in October (and the final one of 2022 on November 26th), the Aston Clinton Society launched its fund-raising campaign with a sell-out quiz night and fish-and-chips supper at the Anthony Hall on October 14th.

Sponsored by Signature Estates and Carr Richards Solicitors, more than 80 people were put through their paces by our highly entertaining quiz master Aron Sharma with questions ranging from cockney rhyming slang to politics. Judging from the positive feedback we received afterwards, this won't be our last.



The success of the evening would not have been possible without the generous support of our villagers and local business community who also provided a great selection of raffle prizes. A massive thanks to everyone who participated, contributed and volunteered on the night. The event raised over £1600 towards our first fund-raising initiative, the installation of new white village gates on four of the five main entry routes into Aston Clinton. Our application to apply for additional funding is

being supported by our Parish Council and we are aiming to have the gates installed in early 2023. The gates will also help to promote road safety by displaying a "Please drive carefully" speed awareness message. To enhance the visual perception that this is a village that residents take pride in, we will be planting out spring bulbs at the base of the gates. We have applied to Bucks CC for a planting and cultivation licence which will also allow these areas to be maintained by the Society in the future.



Eagle-eyed residents may have noticed our growing band of litter-pickers are now wearing hi-viz vests, complete with our Aston Clinton Society logo on the back. These have been kindly donated to us by Laxton Properties, to whom we extend our thanks.

We are already looking forward to 2023, with our committee working on a number of ideas for the village, including a spring Gala Ball and other fund-raising events for all ages; working with the parish council on how to discourage graffiti on street furniture and installing more litter bins, and a residents' survey to gauge views on which areas of the village are most suitable for rewilding.

Chilterns MS Centre services to stroke survivors

Earlier this year, the Chilterns MS Centre began a pilot programme to open its services to people with neurological conditions other than MS, starting with Parkinson's Disease. Due to its success, the pilot has now been extended and the Centre is now offering its services to stroke survivors



Being diagnosed with a neurological condition can be a daunting experience but the Chilterns MS Centre provides a wide range of treatments and services that support people on their journey, services that go beyond what the NHS is able to offer. These services include physiotherapy, hydrotherapy, occupational therapy, speech and language therapy, counselling, dietician advice, acupuncture, a range of leisure groups, not to mention the provision of a supportive community. All of which help empower people with neurological conditions to live their life to the full.

Over 500 people with MS make use of the services offered by the Wendover-based charity and, since the pilot began, over 30 people with Parkinson's Disease have taken advantage of it.

Stroke survivors can often face the same or similar challenges to people with MS or Parkinson's so the Centre is keen to use the skills and experience it has built up over its 37-year history to enhance their quality of life too.

"We are really excited about the success of the pilot programme so far," said Amy Smissen, Head of Integrated Clinical Services "The really positive feedback we've been getting from our MS members is being echoed loud and clear by our new Parkinson's members so we are really thrilled to be able to do more for more people."

Can you hear me?

Have you noticed that when you get to a certain age, everyone around you starts to mumble? Not only your family and friends, but the people on radio and TV do it too. That's when you need a good friend to say 'you need to get your hearing tested.'





First you have to get someone to check your ears to see if they have wax needing removal. Mine did, so next you have to find somewhere private to have the wax removed, as this is a service no longer offered by the NHS. Then you have to return to your practice to confirm that your ears are clear, and at that point the GP makes a referral.

I was sent an appointment quite quickly, with a questionnaire asking me to identify five situations in which my hearing was causing problems, and to rank them in order of importance. This done, I was off to the audiology department at Stoke Mandeville.

The testing was comprehensive, and I had a thorough explanation of my loss. The test results co-coincided precisely with the situations I had identified as difficult. I was given a further appointment in about a month's time to get my new aids.

I returned with some trepidation. I know many people who got this far, were given their aids, but never really got to grips with them. My dear old Dad resolutely refused to wear his: 'where's your hearing aids, Dad?' 'They're in their box, listening.'Several friends wear them intermittently, but it was explained to me that getting used to them is as much about training your brain as your ears, so I was determined. The aids are tiny, and I was told I have 'petite ears' so when they are in, they are a good fit necessary for doing things like pilates exercises. So off I went, hearing aids in, to be reviewed in six weeks.

I have to confess that if I'd lived alone, I'd have been back after a few days as I struggled to get them into my ears correctly. You can't see what you are doing, and the little tubes are very small and springy. My partner had to put them in for me, so I had visions of never being able to go away without him ever again. However, after a couple of weeks I'd mastered them. The biggest delight was birdsong - my garden robin was deafening, and I hadn't realised how much hearing I'd lost. In my office I thought there must be a bomb - I had never noticed the ticking of the clock. Turning the pages of a newspaper was surprisingly loud, and flushing the loo was like standing by Niagara Falls. On the downside, I kept thinking people were talking to me when they weren't.

But we are so lucky: a wonderful service and free. We take our struggling NHS so much for granted, and yet those little aids have made such a difference to my life, and those around me. If you know you need help, do get it - you won't regret it. Alison Beck

Be Bright, Be Seen

With darker mornings and evenings now upon us, the council is reminding people of the simple but sensible actions they can take to keep themselves and their families safe when out and about.

Dark days combined with foggy and misty weather all have an impact on visibility. To stay safe when walking, cycling or scooting to school, parents and carers are reminded about the importance of fluorescent and reflective materials on clothing. Fluorescent fabrics work

well during daylight and the hours of dusk but won't show up in the dark so it's important to also look for reflective fabrics and consider adding reflective tape to bags and clothes to ensure you can be seen in the dark by car headlights.

Anyone cycling during winter months should ensure bike lights are clean and in good working order. It is important to remember, it is against the law to cycle at night without a white front light, a red back light and a red reflector at the back of your bike.

Q. When were you appointed to the role of Benefice Administrator?

A. I joined the team on 4th September 2019, and I absolutely love my job.

Q. What does the job entail?

A. My job is really varied, I run our Facebook page and website for all three churches as well as liaising with families about weddings, baptisms, or funerals. I help organise the community events that happen and also deal with all incoming phone calls and emails - these can be about bell ringing, donations for families in need and services that happen within the churches.

Q. What did you do before that?

A. I worked for over 20 years in Field Marketing in various roles - administration and recruitment. If you see someone in Tesco putting out Mars bars and they don't work for Tesco, they would have probably been employed by me.

Q. What gives you the most satisfaction in your role as Benefice Administrator and why?

A. Helping people in times of joy and grief as well as being part of a wonderful community in and outside of the church.

Q. The Rhubarb Café will celebrate its 10th anniversary next year. What's the secret of its success?

A. Rhubarb Café, which I am manager of (as well as my Benefice Administrator role), is a popular community café. No-one is ever turned away and I try to ensure that there is always a good variety of home-made cakes, tea/coffee and once a month we now also offer home-made soup and a bread roll.

I think that part of the success of Rhubarb Café is down to the atmosphere within as well as the variety of customers that attend.

Q. How many volunteers help in the café?

A. There are over 40 ladies who bake, serve and work in the kitchen. There is also a small team of men who set up/put away the tables and chairs every Monday. I am always on the lookout for new volunteers so if you can bake or are available to work occasional Mondays, please email me on *RhubarbCafe1@gmail.com* or call 01296 632488.

Q. What are your plans for the future of the café?

A. Recently the café was awarded an Aston Clinton Parish Council grant, so we are now able to offer Tassimo Coffee/Hot Chocolate at £2 and we have also introduced home-baked savoury items.

The next plan is to fundraise for an accessible toilet within St Michael's as this will enable people who have limited mobility, have a carer, or use a wheelchair to attend the café. Also with the accessible toilet, there will be somewhere for parents of babies to change nappies.

If you are able to donate money to this fund please contact me.

Q. Do you live in Aston Clinton?

Unfortunately not, although I would love to.

Q. How long have you lived in the area?

I live in Broughton, which is about two miles way so have a very easy drive to work. I have lived in Aylesbury for over 20 years.

Q. What are your hobbies, what do you do for fun?

A. I run, although not very fast, twice a week with On The Run which is a local friendly running group. I also take part in Park Run every Saturday with my 14-year-old son and yes he always beats me by about 18 minutes! It is a great community event.

I also love to read and normally have a book on the go – nothing better than sitting with a cup of tea and a good book.

Q. What's your favourite music?

A. 1980s music is my absolute favourite. I spent my formative years dancing and listening to Wham, Spandau Ballet and Duran Duran to name a few.

Grow It, Cook It, Eat It

Are you worried about higher grocery bills and the rise in cost of living? Do you find yourself struggling to know what to do with the fresh produce you buy?

The Buckinghamshire Council supported 'Grow It, Cook It, Eat It' initiative helps residents to put nutritious and fresh food on their table. As the number of food parcels distributed to households in Buckinghamshire reached 13,718 in the first six months of 2022, many residents are looking for help to find affordable and healthy solutions and alternatives. Grow It, Cook It, Eat It is a community-led project that focuses on growing healthy produce, meanwhile educating local residents about maintaining and harvesting crops to allow people to grow their own food.

There is no cost or membership to visit one of the growing sites, and very little to no commitment - anyone can visit when they have spare time. What doesn't get taken home from the allotments is donated back to the community.

If you're a grower and sometimes find yourself with excess fruit and vegetables you can also give back to those in your community who need it via the Grow to Give project where surplus produce from allotments and gardens goes towards helping the community via local food banks to help households who may need extra support to access healthy and nutritious foods.

Check the Grow to Give website to find your nearest donation allotment site and free access to recipes and cooking videos.

The initiative also provides free cooking sessions delivered by our fully trained Volunteer Cooking Tutors who will link in with their local community growing site.

Each site has its own dedicated Expert Gardener who is on-hand to offer help and guidance about how to get started with growing your own food.

Angela Macpherson, Cabinet Member for Health and Wellbeing, said:

- "During these difficult times we are proud to support such an amazing project, that provides nutritious, free produce and brings communities together out in the fresh air. I hope that these projects show communities that anyone can grow delicious fruits, vegetables and herbs for their own use - even if it's grown in a window box or plant pot!

Try one of our suggested winter recipes Squash Risotto from Grow to give.

Squash Risotto

Risotto is a delicious creamy comfort food that you can make using lots of different vegetables and other ingredients. It's much easier than you might think and is always tasty and filling.



Ingredients (serves 4):

1kg pumpkin (or butternut squash)

300g risotto rice (washed well)

1 vegetable stock cube

1 onion, finely chopped

1 garlic clove, finely chopped

100g cheese

1 tablespoon olive oil

25g butter

Chopped chives sprinkled on top at the end

You can add other ingredients such as fish, meat, meat substitute. If you don't have pumpkin use any other fresh veg you have to hand.

Method:

- 1. Chop pumpkin into similar size cubes.

 Seeds can be toasted for a snack / garnish.
- Put pumpkin on a baking sheet, drizzle with olive oil. Roast the pumpkin at 180C for around 30 mins until tender and golden
- 3. Dice onion finely and fry in the butter until soft.

 Add the finely chopped garlic.
- 4. Make 1ltr of stock.
- 5. Stir in the rice so it is coated with butter.
- Add a ladle of stock and stir gently until the rice absorbs it. Add the next ladle and repeat until the rice is cooked. The rice should be creamy.
- Grate the cheese and stir through the risotto until melted. Turn the cooked pumpkin through the rice, adding any juices left in the baking tray.
- 8. Snip chives as a garnish and enjoy.

Wendover canal trust marks 25th anniversary

On 7 November Wendover Canal Trust (WCT) staged its biggest ever community engagement event with more than 100 guests from 85 different organisations, to mark the 25th anniversary of work starting on restoration of the Wendover Canal.

The occasion also enabled the Trust to provide an update on its activities, hold a dialogue with representatives from local organisations and thank its current supporters.

The canal, which is actually a rare chalk stream, starts in Wendover and runs for nearly seven miles (11 kilometres) joining the Grand Union Canal at Bulbourne Junction near Tring. Critically, the Grand Union Canal at the 'Tring summit' depends on the Wendover Canal to keep its locks supplied with water.

At the event, which was held in "Your Café in the Park", WCT chairman Clive Johnson said the canal was almost impenetrable when the decision was taken to restore it and the first task was to clear the hawthorn scrub.

He said that volunteer construction started in 1997 and that "our wonderful volunteers have been doing heavy construction work for 25 years - and we are all unpaid."

He added: "Our plan is that by the end of 2025 we will complete our lining of the section which has always leaked near Tring, then we will eventually restore the water level for boats all the way to Wendover. None of this would have been possible without the funders of the restoration and the towpath upgrade."

The canal and its towpath were becoming a green corridor, he said, "accessible to us all to boost our well-being, with increased biodiversity."

More than 30 WCT volunteers liaised with the guests and the event, held on November 1, was sponsored by FCC Environment, Fairhive Homes, Independent Hire and Village Environmental Services.
