Gemma Collis-McCann has just returned from Tokyo, having competed in her third Paralympic Games.



Brought up in Aston Clinton, Gemma Collis, as she then was, went to Aston Clinton Junior school and then Aylesbury High School. The young Gemma was always keen on sports, especially the triple jump, and had aspirations to compete in the London Olympics in 2012. Unfortunately, though, at the age of 15 she developed a serious condition causing great pain in her leg and she had to rely on crutches or a wheelchair. Later, though, Gemma discovered she was qualified to represent Wales in wheelchair basketball and a new future beckoned.

While at Durham University Gemma was approached by a fencing coach, Laszlo Jakab, to take up the sport and the very next year she qualified to represent Britain at the London Paralympics, for which she was also a torch bearer. Four years later she again qualified, this time in Rio.

In 2017 she married Craig McCann, another Paralympian fencer. He later changed sports to paracycling and is now a motivational speaker.

One of Gemma's finest achievements came in 2018 when she won the gold medal at the World Cup in Montreal, the first British woman to do this. In all, she has four World Cup medals.

Preparations for this year's Paralympics were disrupted severely by Covid, meaning 18 months without competition and Gemma had to move back to her parents' home for some months to train. Fortunately, the sacrifice and effort paid off and, now ranked 10 in the world,



our local star again qualified for the British fencing team in both the sabre and epee classes. After a total of nine qualifying bouts she was eventually knocked out of the epee in the round of 16 by a Ukrainian fencer. When not competing, Gemma is vice-chair of the International Wheelchair and Amputee Sports Federation's Wheelchair Fencing Athletes' Council. And, like Craig, is a motivational speaker. She is also a sports journalist with the BBC.

With only three more years to wait for Paris 2024, let's wish Gemma every success in the next stage of her career. As she said in a recent interview "This sport is stuck with me for a while yet".

However, this will need a lot of support and sponsorship is vital to ensure Gemma can push towards the podium in Paris, and beyond. Gemma has been self-funding since 2013 and any contributions would be greatly appreciated.

Aston Clinton FC

Our local football club, Aston Clinton FC, was formed 130 years ago and is one of the oldest in Buckinghamshire.

A new management team of Billy Harrison and Taylor Collins has taken over running the first team this season and they are looking forward to more success on the pitch.





During 2018/19, the last season to finish before the Covid pandemic, the side finished as runners-up in the Spartan South Midlands (SSM) League, division 2 and won the Wycombe District Cup, beating Holmer Green in the final. Since joining the SSM league in 2005 they have won the second division twice but have not been able to progress beyond that because of a lack of floodlights.

The other team in the club, Aston Clinton Sports, is run by Billy Harrison's father, Lee, and they play in the Hellenic league. The club chairman, Ian Middleton, owns Aylesbury Flooring Ltd, which is the club's main sponsor. Several of the rest of the committee are based in the village and the club has always attracted local players. Home games are played on Saturday afternoons in Aston Clinton Park, the club's home since the 1970s. You can be assured of a warm welcome in the Churchill Hall where you can find teas and coffees and a licenced bar which generally opens at 12pm.

A successful season down Church Lane

After the severely restricted 2020 campaign it was lovely to have a largely uninterrupted summer of cricket to enjoy. It was a successful season with too many highlights to really do justice in a short report.

Our 1st XI came 2nd in Division 3 to earn promotion after three seasons at this level. In 14 completed games (Four were abandoned or cancelled) we won 11, tied one and lost just two. Talib Hussein was the top run scorer in the Division with 507 runs at an average of 46, with Safeer Ahmed coming 3rd with 418. Ageless Captain Mike Parsonage again topped the wicket taking charts with 27 at an average of 13 and Aqib Mahmood took 24 at a cost of 12 apiece (finishing 4th and 8th respectively in the Division 3 charts).

The 2nd XI came 5th in Division 5 despite a late burst of good form. A league high of six rain impacted games proved costly as we ended up less than a win away from a promotion place. Liam Smith led the Division 3 runs table with 557 at an average of over 50 but

in a fair reflection of where our weakness lies no one else managed over 200. Skipper Casey Dawson made it a team double by topping the Division's wicket chart with 27 at an average of 16, and Kris Greig's fine maiden full campaign was reflected in 24 wickets costing just 9 each.



Our midweek season was an unqualified success. We won the Coronation Cup for the 1st time since 2003, Mike Parsonage leading from the front with a scarcely believable 5 for 9 against Potten End. We also won the Aylesbury & District Midweek League Cup by defeating our good friends and previous holders IAS in the final, Neil Roberts making crucial contributions with the bat in both finals to nudge us over the winning line. We couldn't quite make it a hat-trick, losing to eventual winners Studham in the semi-final of the inaugural Village T20 Cup. There was some explosive hitting en route to Finals Day, with Mark Ludlow (91 off 30 balls), Pete Allam (98 from 43) and Neil Roberts (85 from 58) all producing outstanding knocks. Unfortunately we had a collective off day in the semi and our chance of an unprecedented treble had gone.

When all of this is added to the successful growth in the Colts section described in previous Village Life issues it has been a year to savour for BACCC. We can now focus our efforts on continuing to improve our facilities over the winter and recruiting more coaches for the juniors as we count down the days until the 2022 season begins. *Phil Samuels*



Planning Permission granted for New Scout Hall 'Ollie's Hall'

The Scouts are delighted that outline planning permission has been granted for a new Scout Hall in Aston Clinton to serve Aston Clinton, Buckland and Drayton Beauchamp. The Scout Hall is to be known as Ollie's Hall in memory of Ollie Gardiner who was a very active Beaver, Cub and Scout. Ollie's Hall will be perfectly located next to Aston Clinton Park and will finally provide Scouts with a building they can call home after decades of moving between facilities (we currently have containers of kit dotted in different villages!).

The land for the hall will be gifted by Professor Ed Peile and his wife Linda, and forms part of a small development, including five new homes, that has been granted planning permission following an application by Laxton Properties and 1st Aston Clinton Scouts. The Scouts have already secured or been pledged circa £150,000 towards the construction of the hall but further fundraising will be needed in due course. Detailed design and construction work will begin as soon as possible.

All that is needed now is agreement from Buckinghamshire Council to grant access rights and to lift a historic restrictive covenant they hold on the land. We very much hope that Buckinghamshire Council will join the Parish Council and local communities in supporting this project and we will provide progress updates in future editions of Village Life.

The Annual Poppy Appeal. This year Remembrance Sunday is 14th November. We are planning to commemorate the fallen and all those who returned injured, not only from the First and Second World Wars, but including all conflicts since. Even today our armed forces are operating in conflict and war zones around the world.



We shall, depending on any covid restrictions, hold our parade of youth organizations, RBL, and a contingent from RAF Halton, at the War Memorial starting at 11am. There will be a short service followed by the 'last post' and the laying of wreaths. We will then march to St Michael's church for our Remembrance Service. The general public from the village

We will not be going door-to-door with our poppies. All the poppies will be in the village shops, bars, and commercial premises for you to pick up and make a donation towards this appeal. The RBL has suffered like many other charities with a fall of income due to Covid and this is an opportunity to make it up.

There may not be a war on but the RBL still has a huge welfare task supporting our ex-servicemen in need from homelessness. mental health from military stress, and physical disabilities. Support may be available through the normal agencies but they sometimes need the RBL to steer them through the bureaucracy. The RBL may supply electric wheelchairs and the like.

Please support us. The Aston Clinton Branch may be small but is still running, whereas many of the village branches have had to close due to lack of support. Why not come and join us? It is not just for the elderly, and we have an association with the school. With more support we could extend our range of activities and visits. Ralph Weston

I see that you have Arthur William Rolfe mentioned in the War Stories section of your website. I came across a photo of his grave in my uncle's (Harold Frank Gamblin) personal war time collection. It appears he 'Died as the result of being electrocuted whilst he was repairing a cable'. www.rafcommands.com/database/wardead/details. php?qnum=107044

My uncle was in the Army in Egypt and not in the RAFVR so it is unlikely he knew Arthur and I do not know why he took this photo. There are other graves with crosses in the background, so this was taken during the war before the CWGC put in their headstones. *Jenny Paterson*

There are still members of the family in Aston Clinton and we can add to this story that Arthur was the oldest of three brothers (the others were George and Norman) living in Brook Street and their mother was Emily, known as Em.

'Plus ça change'

It may seem hard to believe, but there was a time before Village Life existed. In those far off days (before 2011 actually) there was instead a Parish Magazine. Fortunately, there are several archived copies going back to the nineteenth century but, thanks to Jane Preskett, some more recent copies have come to light.

They make fascinating reading, and I was particularly interested in an article by the then rector, Alan Bennett, written exactly 20 years ago. In the light of recent events in Afghanistan there are some interesting parallels. Here is the article as it appeared in 2001.

"World events mean that by the time we come to our Remembrance Day service many of our service men and women will be on active duty, and bases around the country will be on high alert. For the first time in many years, we shall be remembering those who died as a result of war when our country is on a war footing.

Not since the Falklands War have we been so intimately involved in a dispute. We know from war memorials in our own villages what a dreadful sacrifice some people have to make to preserve our freedoms and way of life. There was a time when people thought Remembrance Sunday was out of date; current events

demonstrate how important it is always to remember the enormous cost of war. We pray that this current dispute will be settled and the people of Afghanistan might find peace, security and prosperity.

The leaders of the nations need to remember that one war or dispute tends to breed victors and losers and those who feel grieved in defeat often go on to cause further trouble in the future.

Down the centuries nations have risen in power and influence and declined, and it is often one or two individuals who have spurred nations to greatness of purpose or orgies of destruction. Our own democratic way of life keeps potential power-hungry leaders in check, and we should be grateful that although most people will support our prime minister and President Bush in their actions we should welcome those voices of caution and dissent".

The impact of Covid on early years' learning



Two years ago, if someone had described the last 18 months to me, I would have admired their incredible imagination and suggested script writing as a career. However, here we are tentatively emerging on the other side of the most devastating pandemic in modern history. The pandemic is still impacting our daily lives, but it goes deeper than this with unknown effects caused by significant disruption. As the manager of a Pre-school, I find myself thinking about the impact of the pandemic on the youngest children specifically. We will soon see a generation of children start attending who were born just before or during the pandemic. They have been born into a world with social distancing and masks, where natural exploration has been limited to protect their safety.

Early years curriculums are constructed around the vast array of historical research from renowned theorists that underpins the importance of a child's social capabilities, and the impact on future interactions and academic attainment. Early Years settings recognise that children develop at a high rate during their formative years both socially and cognitively and are tailored to support this, as well as promoting overall wellbeing.

All children aged three and four, as well as some two-year-olds, are entitled to 15 hours of government funding in Ofsted registered Early Years settings. Working parents of three and four-year-old children may also be entitled to an additional 15 hours funded provision and there are also tax-free payment options. To find out what you may be entitled to, visit www.childcarechoices.gov.uk/

Now is such an important time to start thinking about giving this age group

Flu Vaccination Information 2021-2022

We will be offering a flu vaccination to all our eligible patients this year. We will be running our clinics to ensure that we follow current COVID guidelines.

Our first delivery of vaccines is due week commencing 11 October. This delivery date may change, but we hope not! We will make appointments available to book as soon as we have confirmation from our suppliers as we don't want to have to disappoint patients and reschedule appointments.

The clinics will be busy and will be flu vaccinations only. We won't be offering any other services during the clinics and will be unable to deal with other queries. It's very important that we keep the patient flow moving.

Clinics will be held on Saturdays. Dates will be available once our delivery dates are confirmed, and you will need to book an appointment.

We will text our eligible patients, put up posters in our windows, update our website and Facebook page as soon as appointments are available to be booked.

We hope that patients will be able to book their appointment using the AskFirst app and are currently in discussion with them about this. This will mean that patients won't need to telephone us to book an appointment unless they don't have access to the app. More news to follow.

We will be giving flu vaccines at all our care homes and to our housebound patients and will schedule these around our stock and staff availability.

Children's flu vaccines will be given for those who are eligible and included in the GP vaccination programme. There will be a COVID vaccination booster programme happening during the autumn running alongside the flu vaccines. Our plan is that the COVID booster vaccines will be given at the Guttman Stadium by our local team, with GP Practices running their own flu clinics due to differing delivery dates. Further information is required around the COVID booster programme before the details can be finalised, but we will keep you updated as information becomes available to us.

Helping Hedgehogs

The British Hedgehog Preservation Society

The hedgehog is the UK's only prickly mammal, but it's in trouble. Despite being voted Britain's Favourite Mammal, hedgehog numbers have been declining for many years. Many of you will have spotted hedgehogs in your gardens and parks, but sightings are becoming rarer! So rare, in fact, that hedgehogs have recently been classified as "Vulnerable to Extinction". Whilst this is a scary state of affairs, it is not too late to reverse the decline

Hedgehogs are finding it harder to track down a good place to live and enough food. Hedgehogs like to eat bugs, worms and grubs. People have been busy boxing in their gardens with fences, blocking access for hedgehogs. There may be a brilliant garden at number 23 and another at number 27, but if number 25 has solid fences around it, the hedgehog cannot travel from one to the other. Because hedgehogs travel around a mile in a night, it's important that they have lots of joined up gardens to use.

Hedgehog-like creatures have roamed the earth for around 20 million years, outliving sabre-toothed tigers and mammoths! They are found over most of mainland Britain and do surprisingly well in our cities and towns, so long as they have enough connected areas to roam around. They are one of our most recognisable animals with their coat of spines (which are actually modified hairs) and the ability to roll into a ball at a moment's notice. They are often referred to as the "gardener's friend" and most people are thrilled to spot one in their garden.

If hedgehogs are in trouble it raises concerns about other species and the environment in general. Similarly, when we take action to improve things for hedgehogs, we will be helping lots of other wildlife too.





BUT it's not all doom and gloom! There are lots of ways we can help! Why not try some of the following ideas:

- Create 13cm x 13cm gaps in your boundary fence as a 'hedgehog highway' and ask your neighbours to do the same. Offer hedgehog food, or meaty cat or dog food, or some cat biscuits alongside a bowl of water at night.
- Make your garden wildlife friendly stop using slug pellets or pesticides and leave one corner or the edges "a bit wild".
- Become a Hedgehog Champion! We run a project called Hedgehog Street with People's Trust for Endangered Species – see www. hedgehogstreet.org
- · Create a log pile in your garden, this will provide natural shelter and food - don't disturb it.

- Make a point of asking everyone you know to check for hedgehogs before strimming or mowing. Check compost heaps before sticking a big fork in there too!
- If you've got a pond, make sure hedgehogs can get out if they fall in. Provide ramps or steps up steep sided ponds.
- Put up a display of posters at your local garden centre, shop, school, etc. – the British Hedgehog Preservation Society can supply poster packs for free! See www. britishhedgehogs.org.uk
- When we get near Bonfire Night ask your local organiser to "think hedgehog" before lighting a public bonfire.

All the above are great proactive ways of helping hedgehogs and hopefully you'll be rewarded by seeing happy, healthy hedgehogs out at night. BUT if you do see any hedgehogs out during the day looking lethargic, wobbly, injured or covered in flies, then they will need your help. Get them into a big, deep box and get them indoors. Keep them warm, calm and quiet until you can get help. Give them an old towel or similar and offer them a small amount of cat or dog or hedgehog food and water (don't force feed). Call the British Hedgehog Preservation Society on 01584 890801 for the contact details for your nearest hedgehog rescue centre.

Although we all love hedgehogs, they don't have much protection under the law at the moment. Their classification now as vulnerable to extinction means something needs to change – we all love hedgehogs, and no-one wants to see them disappear. Please consider signing the government petition to give them better protection: petition.parliament.uk/petitions/550379 photos provided by BHPS.


AGPSAC is a small, friendly club with a great mix of people who are just waiting to welcome new divers or those who may have trained elsewhere and want to get back in the water.

Carol Macdonald is the Head Teacher at Aston Clinton school.

Q. When were you appointed to the role of head teacher?

A. I was officially appointed in March 2021.

Q. How long have you been teaching at Aston Clinton?

A. I took the post of Deputy Head with a full-time teaching commitment in September 2008. Since then I have taught in every year group.

Q. What has been the biggest challenge for the school during this pandemic?

A. Keeping us together as a community with the obvious barrier that we were all in different places!

Q. What was your first role as a teacher and how has your career progressed?

A. I started teaching in September 2000 in Chesham. My first class was a Year 3 class and I still remember them as if it were yesterday. My career quickly progressed with the support of my Headteacher. Initially, I had leadership responsibility for Design Technology then Physical Education,

Information Communications Technology and Maths. My background in psychology also enabled me to take on the role of special educational needs coordinator. My Headteacher supported my next step into Deputy Headship. I successfully completed my NPOH (National Professional Qualification of Headship) in January 2012.

Q. Which role has given you the most satisfaction and why?

A. All my roles have given me satisfaction. I love working with children to ensure that they develop as individuals.

Q. How has teaching changed over the years?

A. Policy may have changed but ultimately quality first teaching has never changed. It is about ensuring that each child in your care achieves their full potential.

Q. What advice would you give to anyone wanting to train as a teacher?

A. It's an endless commitment which is as rewarding as having your own children.

Q. Do you live in Aston Clinton?

A. No.

Q. How long have you lived in the area?

A. I have lived in and around Buckinghamshire for the last 20 years.

Q. Are you involved in any activities/groups in Aston Clinton?

A. No

Q. What are your hobbies, what do you do for fun?

A. I like reading but end up reading children's books and cook books. As a full-time working mum, I struggle to make time for myself so I have just started the couch to 5K training programme.

Q. What's your favourite music?

A. Anything chilled.

Q. What's your favourite film?

A. Abominable - as my threeyear old is fascinated by it and I love the sentiment behind it.

Q. What was the first car you owned and what do you drive now?

Glamorous guests of Aston Clinton

Until recently I had little idea how many illustrious visitors and occupants Aston Clinton has had over the years.

During its heyday of the 1960's and 70's the Bell Inn was renowned for its gastronomy. Richard Burton and Elizabeth Taylor were regular visitors, in fact Burton purchased the \$1.1 million Taylor-Burton diamond using the public bar telephone, whilst surrounded by locals sipping their beer. Other guests included Jackie Onassis and the Rolling Stones. In January 1977 when Keith Richards had to attend Aylesbury Crown Court, he and Mick Jagger gave a press conference at the Bell.

Aston Martin held a lunch at the Bell Inn in 1976 to preview their new car with members of the Lagonda Club, and Douglas Bader, the WWII Spitfire ace, was one of the guests of honour. In earlier years, a more infamous guest was the occultist Aleister Crowley. In 1944, after months of German bombing, Crowley

left London and moved to the Bell Inn, which he described as "a most delightful, really old inn, big open fire, food incredibly good. But nothing to do, and no one to talk to."

The Bell also has literary associations. In the 1920's it provided a welcome and frequent refuge to Evelyn Waugh. He was employed as a schoolmaster at the prep school that then existed in Green Park. He often walked to the Bell for a drink, dinner or just the warmth from the fire, a more pleasant alternative to the school food or bleak common room. Waugh's good friend Richard Plunket Greene, racing motorist, jazz musician and author, was also a schoolmaster there.

In more recent times, the Bell was even referenced in a comedy sketch in the TV series "A Bit of Fry and Laurie". "So, Sir Peter, where to from here? Well, I think probably the Bell at Aston Clinton for a spot of tea."

It is not just the Bell Inn we have to thank for some of our eminent visitors. The former mansion at Green Park was home to Sir Anthony de Rothschild and his wife Louise from the 1850's and then to Lord and Lady Battersea (nee Constance Rothschild). Their visitors included prime ministers Gladstone and Disraeli, poet Matthew Arnold and novelist William Makepeace Thackeray. After his visit, the author Henry James referred to "sweet old Aston Clinton".

Louise Jopling, a prominent Victorian artist was a frequent guest and became close friends with Sir Anthony's daughters Constance and Annie, whose portraits she painted in 1876 and 1878. She wrote "I was not idle at Aston Clinton. I painted there a background for a picture that I finished afterwards and exhibited and sold at the Grosvenor Gallery... I spent a happy day painting in the wood, sheltered from the autumn breezes outside. I remember many incidents of my Aston Clinton visit, especially my chagrin when, in having a lesson in billiards from Mr. Montefiore, I cut the green cloth! However, nothing could have been kinder than the way my confession was received, and a man summoned from London quickly repaired the damage."

In August 1887 a parliamentary cricket match took place at Aston Clinton. Players included Gladstone, Lord Curzon, Lord Lewisham and MPs from the House of Commons.

Guests to the mansion even included Royalty, and in her book "Reminiscences" Constance Battersea noted "I remember ... a dance we gave in 1873, when the Prince of Wales (Edward VII) honoured our house at Aston Clinton with a visit". Another guest of the Rothschild's was the future Czar Alexander III, while he was the czarevitch. He was the father of Nicholas II, the last Emperor of all Russia.

A later royal visit to the village was described by novelist Mrs Humphrey Ward in 1914. "Dorothy and I motored over early one morning last week to Aston Clinton Park to see the King inspect a large gathering of recruits. It was a beautiful morning, with the misty Chilterns looking down upon the wide stretches of the park, and the bodies of drilling men. The King must have been up early, for he had inspected the camp at ten (thirty-five miles from London) and was in the park by eleven. There was no ceremony whatever, and only a few neighbours and children looking on. It had been elaborately announced that he would inspect troops that day in Norfolk!"

Golden Globe winning director Roy Ward Baker of the 1958 film "A Night to Remember" about the Titanic disaster, lived in the village. Baker once recalled, that on a freezing November morning, he had to persuade his star, Kenneth More, and a dozen extras to jump into an icy open-air swimming pool at Ruislip Lido which was doubling up as the North Atlantic, as Pinewood did not have a pool large

enough to film the lifeboat scenes. It is perhaps thanks to Baker that Roger Moore opened the village fete in 1968. No icy swimming pools were involved on that occasion. *Helen Sharp*

It is with great sadness that we learnt of Lorna Price's passing on 17 August. We believe she was aged 98.

Lorna was elected president on the death of her husband Reg Price. They were both founder members of the Society and used to pay for the Great Horwood Silver Band to play at the society's shows. Together they were a team, especially at show time, when Lorna helped Reg mount his exhibits.

Their knowledge of fruit and veg growing and showing was extensive, as it was with Chrysanthemums and Dahlias, which were Reg's passion. At the end of the season, they used to carefully dry out the Dahlia corms above the kitchen stove. It was Reg that told me to plant shallots on the shortest day of the year and harvest them on the longest. And he was right because by the longest day the tops have keeled over. They knew which apples were best for showing too and these were grown in their orchard in New Road, which abutted onto Reg's father's abattoir in Green End Street.

Both Lorna and Reg were ardent cricket fans and regularly used to spend an afternoon at the ground in Church Lane watching Aston Clinton play. In his younger days Reg had played football for Aston Clinton, too.

It is an end of an era for our society.

Back in August an enthusiastic crowd was entertained at a comedy evening at St Mary's, Drayton Beauchamp. Another attraction on the evening was the herby scones provided by Antonia Charalambous. They were an absolute triumph and Antonia has kindly agreed to share the recipe with us.



The real name of the scones is Halloumotes, meaning halloumi pies. The recipe is very easy, and you can make them so quickly. From now on I will rename them 'halloumi scones' so all my British friends can pronounce them.

Ingredients:

4 cups of flour

1 cup of oil (I use half olive oil/ half sunflower oil)

1 cup of Fanta or any sparkling orange juice

1 or 2 halloumi cheese it depends how rich vou like it to be

Fresh mint

Fresh coriander

Drv mint

Pepper

Salt

Seeds - If you want some

Method:

- 1. Wash all your herbs, no need to dry them.
- 2. Blend with your hands the flour, juice, oil, salt and pepper. It will become a very soft dough.
- 3. Add all other ingredients.
- 4. You can make them into small scones or a big bread loaf.
- 5. Cook on 180°c till golden colour appears.




