### Letter from the Baptist minister

Dear Friends

Villages are important places, because the potential of them is such that bonds and community can occur in them more readily than larger towns, cities and conurbations. The numbers of people within a village enable there to be a greater focus on things that matter to that particular group. Recent issues to do with industry and housing plans would be examples.

Indeed our villages are situated in a beautiful part of the country. All of us are grateful for the tranquil surroundings of this area – the rolling hills, the trees in their variety and the sense of the freshness of the air in the early mornings. We have a communal interest in these things too.

The word community has been given many definitions. One of them is 'a group of interacting people, possibly living in close proximity, and often refers to a group that shares some common values'. That seems a little 'cold', as definitions sometimes can be. The Bible uses the word 'community' which literally means 'common, belonging equally to several'. The word 'commune' is derived from this

too, a word that implies a feeling at one and togetherness.

In the Church we try
so hard to make sure that we exhibit the
better qualities of this word. We endeavour
to be in harmony with one another in our
worship of God.

Like the villages here, we have values we hold dear and many will be in accord with those of people generally – there will be a crossover. Yet we also have other values because of our beliefs. I believe that every person needs 'communion' with God, after all he is the greatest expression of community there is – one God as Father, Son and Spirit.

With that in mind I open the doors of our Church to you, and I welcome you to experience this type of community with us too. But whether you take up this offer or not, let us make sure that we do all we can to honour the better qualities of the word 'community'.

### What's in a name?

ASTON CLINTON, you'll be glad to know, is the only settlement of that name in the world! There are dozens of Astons in England alone and hundreds of Clintons most of which are in the USA.

A Saxon 'ton' was a small settlement usually centred round a farm. Aston was, therefore, east ton as opposed to West ton at Weston Turville. It is believed that Aston originally grew up at the intersection of the Roman Akeman Street (now the A41) and the ancient Icknield Way. Excavations which took place as part of the by-pass construction revealed a Saxon burial site at the top of Tring Hill.

William Clinton was, it seems, a Saxon rather than a Norman, who somehow managed to ally himself with the ruling Normans in the 11th century and was granted the land in and around Aston. Either he or one of his descendants adopted a 'de', possibly to sound more Norman, and in 1232 the list of Rectors in St Michael's Church shows the appointment of the first rector by Sir William de Clinton.

Jumping ahead to the 20th century, our village became world famous as a result of the Aston Hill Climb. From 1904 until

1925, when hill climbs on the public highway were allowed, the event held at Aston Hill became a classic over the 20 years of its existence. Lionel Martin made his first ascent of the hill - which started 20 yards from the junction with Upper Icknield Way and stretched for a mile up the hill in April 1914. He went on to be extremely successful and built his own 'sporting light car' in 1915 which he called the Aston Martin after his success in the Aston Hill Climb. Thus ASTON MARTIN started the legend of ASTON MARTIN a brand of English cars, world famous and built in Bucks at Newport Pagnell and proudly bearing thename of our village.

More recently, in the 1960s and 70s,
The Bell attracted world wide attention as
the place where the stars wanted to be
seen. Michael Harris played host to
Elizabeth Taylor and Richard Burton,
Mick Jagger, Margot Fonteyn and
Roberto Arias. Your writer was almost
run down in Green End Street by Bruce
Forsyth in a Rolls Royce!

So whilst we live peaceably in an historic village set beneath the Chiltern Hills in rural Bucks, remember also that the whole world, including James Bond, knows of Aston Clinton! James Adam

### What are Values?

AT Aston Clinton School, we believe that our role is to develop the whole child. What does that mean? I hear you ask. Aren't schools all about subjects, test results and grades? If we are to develop the whole child we need to help children become happy, stable people who are resilient and have the skills they need for their future life, both in work and in their leisure time.

A recent development in school has been to introduce Values Education. emphasising the education of the whole child and high personal moral and academic standards.

Values Education is not a new subject to be added to the curriculum. Rather it is an educational philosophy, an approach to teaching and learning that underpins the way a school develops good relationships and promotes positive human values.

Values Education aims to promote a common set of values that will positively affect behaviour and contribute to the peace and well-being of society. It also aims to inspire individual children to choose their own positive personal, social, moral and spiritual values and be aware of ways of developing and deepening them as citizens of the world.

Our Values determine our thinking and behaviour. They are the principles that act as the guides to our behaviour. Our Values are the internal standards we use when we decide if a particular belief or action is good, desirable or not. They help us to make decisions and evaluate the actions of others

As a school we are growing rapidly. This brings welcome new members to our community. Our challenge is to ensure our school ethos and the positive, calm atmosphere in school is still evident. Values Education enables us to make explicit the kind of behaviours we believe are important and introduces a moral vocabulary through the explicit and regular consideration of values words. It will help us maintain a calm, peaceful and purposeful climate in the classroom where there is mutual respect. Talking about Values supports the development of emotional intelligence as it positively affects children's self-confidence and selfesteem. We know that when children feel good about themselves they do better in school academically too.

By talking with the children about their guiding principles, or Values, it helps them to appreciate difference in others and to appreciate and understand themselves more. This raised self-awareness then allows them to take greater responsibility for their behaviour and learning and develop self discipline.

Overall, it allows children to think about the kind of life worth living and what they want for themselves. This is not a quick fix initiative, but a long term focus for the school. As a school community, the Values we feel are the most important for our children to develop are: honesty, trust, friendship, tolerance, caring, appreciation, respect, happiness, co-operation, humility, responsibility, courage and quality.

Each value has been allocated time during the school year when it will be the focus for the whole school community. Through the Friday Flyer and the school website everyone will know what Value we are actively thinking about. Everyone needs to be involved because Values need to be modelled as well as being taught. Children learn by what they hear and see; they mimic adults. Therefore all adults who come into contact with our children have a rôle to play by 'walking the talk'-demonstrating that the Values we feel, and have identified, are important in life. Can you 'walk the talk' and join us in helping our children become successful citizens of the future?

### New Chairman of Aston Clinton Parish Council

AT THE MAY MEETING of Aston Clinton Parish Council, Richard Maskell was elected as the new Chairman. Councillor Maskell was born in Aston Clinton in 1944, twenty-two years after the Maskell family moved to the village when Richard's father was 15. However, he can

trace his maternal family living in Aston Clinton and Weston Turville back to the 18th century.

As a youth Richard was a chorister and a bell ringer at the village church, which he still attends. He was educated at Aston Clinton School as was his grandfather, mother, brother, sister, all of his

three children and four of his eight grandchildren.

On leaving school he joined the local police force serving across the whole of the Thames Valley from Reading to Milton Keynes in a number of departments, rising to the rank of Inspector. He received three commendations from the Chief Constable for the arrest of armed criminals as part of the Armed Response Team.

On retiring from the police Richard was

employed in the transport section of the County Council. For his last four working years he was seconded to Buckinghamshire Community Action as a rural transport officer. There he set up a number of transport projects which are still operating today: Wheels to Work, The Youth Bus and a number of community bus services.

He became a Parish Councillor twelve years ago aiming to work with his fellow

councillors in representing the views of the residents and to improve the quality of life in the village.

Richard has been married to Janet for 44 years. He is interested in history and is a member of the National Trust and English Heritage. He is a Trustee of the Turpin's Charity and

Aylesbury Vale Dial-a-Ride.

He hopes to continue the good work of the previous chairman and widen some of the services the Council provides. The Council has spent money provided from housing development mainly in the park and he feels that further money could be spent in the wider community. The Council will consult the residents of the village for ideas on how this should be implemented.

### Parish Council Meeting Room

Earlier this year, thirty people were present when David Lidington MP officially opened the Aston Clinton Parish Council meeting room in Aston Clinton Park, next to the Youth Club. In an address to those present, Mr Lidington acknowledged the work of the council and the numerous activities it provided. He wished the council well for the future.

Aston Clinton Parish Council is one of the largest village parish councils in Aylesbury Vale. Aston Clinton has a population of over 3,500. The Council is not only responsible for the village but also for the maintenance of Aston Clinton Park: 43 acres with its numerous sporting facilities and the main buildings. It is also responsible for other properties in the village, including the churchyard, because it is designated as a cemetery.

Until recently, the Council hired village halls for its meetings and the clerk had to work from home. With the expanding development in the village this has proved to be impractical. The new meeting room now provides an office for the clerk, and a place for the residents to meet councillors and view development plans.

### **Funds for Community Projects**

The Parish Council is seeking the views of the residents of Aston Clinton as to how certain funds are spent in the village. Planning authorities are allowed to enter into a legally-binding agreement or planning obligation with the landowner as part of the granting of planning permission.

The agreement is a way of making a development more acceptable in planning terms. They are increasingly used to support the provision of services and infrastructures such as recreational facilities, education and affordable housing.

Aston Clinton Parish Council has used some of this money to replace bus shelters, provide more play equipment in the children's play area in the park, the skateboard facility and providing a water supply for the allotments.

However, the Parish Council is seeking to broaden the use of these funds, but they have to be used for the village community as a whole. If you would like to offer an idea, please put it in writing to Claire Hill, the Parish Clerk, whose email address is: parishcouncil@astonclinton.org

### Aston Clinton Bowls Club

THE EARLIEST RECORD of competitive bowling in the village is from December 1905 when the newly-formed Tring Bowling Club held its first annual dinner at the Rose and Crown Hotel and listed amongst its guests the secretaries of both Aylesbury and Aston Clinton bowling clubs. In 1978 the Parish Council allocated land in Aston Clinton Park to the club and work began on the long process of constructing a full six-rink green. The move to the park was completed in 1986.

The aim of Aston Clinton Bowls Club is to promote and foster the game of Flat Green Bowls and provide facilities for the social needs of its members. Full membership is open to men and women over 18 years, Junior members between 14 and 18 years and Social members who enjoy the non-playing facilities of the Club.

The Club caters for both beginners and experienced players with three qualified coaches. It fulfils a programme of friendly matches with neighbouring clubs, both at weekends and weekdays from April to September each year. Members can elect

to play in these matches, Club competitions or 'roll-ups'. Experienced players can represent the Club in competitions organised by the County.

The Club has a thriving social side with fund raising events including Quiz Nights, Race Nights and Lunches. In the summer months a newsletter is distributed to Members. The Club has a reputation for its friendly atmosphere and in the manner that it plays bowls. There are no paid employees and, whenever possible, Members carry out any maintenance tasks but are not put under any obligation.

The Club has a licensed bar and catering is provided as appropriate.

### The Arla proposal

As you are no doubt aware, the plans have now been submitted for an industrial complex on 150 acres of agricultural land.

Planning application reference numbers are as follows:

11/00962/APP - Land to east of College Road North, Aston Clinton. Proposed dairy (1.3BN L), associated offices, pallet store, energy centre, cool corridor, three gatehouses, vehicle maintenance unit, transport office, wash enclosure, drivers' store, car & commercial parking spaces. Balancing pond, engineering works to create landscape bund & diversion of Drayton Mead brook, landscaping and new priority junction from College Road, external works to include vehicle wash, fuel island & weighbridges and associated access.

The other three applications are in outline form with details reserved for subsequent approval.

The reference numbers are:

**11/00963/AOP.** To the north of the dairy site is the proposed B8 development comprising a regional distribution centre of 23,226 square metres, with associated access, parking and landscaping.

**11/00964/AOP**. To the south of Dropshort Farm and to the south and east of the dairy site is proposed a B1c/B2/B8 industrial development of 22,297 square metres with ancillary offices and associated areas, parking and landscaping.

**11/00965/AOP**. To the north-west of the dairy site is the proposed B2/B8 development of 41,806 square metres with associate access, parking and landscaping.

It is expected that the application(s) will be referred for decision to the Planning

Committee before the end of the year. In view of the significance of the Arla proposal, objections and comments on the applications will be accepted by the Council up to the date of the hearing, despite the expiry of the three-week period normally allowed.

### Goods deliveries - a plea

Buckland Parish Council is a village with only one access; problems are caused when large lorries use the road, only to find that they cannot turn round.

Unfortunately, once in the village, desperate measures are then taken to try to get out, resulting in damage to residents' gateways. It would help if residents ordering goods could impress upon their suppliers the restrictions that their drivers will face, and suggest they use smaller delivery vehicles wherever possible.

### Dog litter in Buckland

There is still a problem in the parish with 'doggy bags' being abandoned inconsiderately. The problem is particularly noticeable along Lower Buckland, between Cherry Farm and the canal. The owner of Cherry

Farm is extremely generous with his time in clearing along this area, but it is a job which should not be necessary.

Please ensure you pick up your dog litter and take it home. Do not throw the bag in hedges or ditches, they have a more important role to play than act as dog litter bins.

Please note that there is a fine of £1,000 if you are caught in the act.

### Dog owners' responsibilities

The following email arrived recently in the *Village Life* editorial office:

"Recently, I have had my early morning walks in the local fields and Buckland Wharf canal towpath ruined by unleashed dogs jumping up on me, last week it was by two white labradors who not only nearly knocked me down but hurt my back and covered my clothing in mud. Their owners just laughed and said it was because I was eating something and the dogs wanted some. I was clearly very distressed but the owners didn't even apologise, it was as if it was my fault for being there. Whilst most dog owners are considerate, I'm afraid I have encountered those that are not. It must be very frightening for those who have had issues with dogs in their lives. I feel I can no longer enjoy my much needed peaceful walk in the mornings."

This sounds as though it might have been rather an extreme case. Nevertheless dog owners should remember that, common courtesy



apart, they are legally accountable for the behaviour of their dogs – Ed.
